### REPORTS FROM MAYOR, COUNCIL AND COMMITTEES

Mayor Counts – Stated that the recent flood was the second major flood in less than two years and thanked Chief Shockey for his leadership during this time. Mayor Counts also thanked staff for a job well done. He informed council that he had received a call from Governor Greitens, who stated that he heard Arnold was doing very well in dealing with the flood. Mayor Counts also thanked Ameren. Due to the fact that we had 3 days' notice to prepare, they were able to pull electricity from individual homes instead of the entire grid. Mayor Counts also thanked Missouri American Water and their supervisor Mark Migneco for keeping the pumps running along with Jason Fulbright and EJ Fleischmann for manning the volunteer tent, Gary Plunk for working the shuttle bus and Dr. Wipke from the Fox School District and the students for volunteering.

**EJ Fleischmann** – **Ward 1** – Echoed the Mayor's remarks and thanked Chief Shockey and city staff. Mr. Fleischmann stated he received many phone calls from residents thanking the city for a job well done.

Gary Plunk – Ward 4 – Complimented all departments on a great job. Mr. Plunk also thanked The Leader newspaper for its article on the police department.

Vern Sullivan – Ward 3 – Stated the article in The Leader regarding the police department was great. Mr. Sullivan also thanked Bryan Richison and Chief Shockey for keeping the council informed during the recent flood.

Butch Cooley – Ward 4 – Inquired about signage at Bender and the Outer Road. Ed Blattner informed him this has already been completed.

**David Owens** – Ward 2 – Thanked Mayor Counts for the proclamation presented to the Police Department and The Leader newspaper for its article. Mr. Owens also thanked staff for a great job working the flood.

Jason Fulbright – Ward 1 – Echoed everyone's sentiments regarding the flood. Mr. Fulbright stated that we are following the same emergency plan that was followed in the 2015 flood; the difference with this flooding event is we had time to prepare, 3 days of preparation time helped us immensely. Mr. Fulbright thanked the police officers and staff. He also thanked EJ Fleischmann for manning the volunteer tent.

Brian McArthur – Ward 2 – Stated 15 homes in Bayshore were affected by the flood. Mr. McArthur would like to look into the difference in the flood stages between the city park area and the Bayshore area. During the last two flooding events the actual height of the flood was different than expected. He would like to see that remedied so the residents in that area can better prepare for what may come. Mr. McArthur also thanked the Building Department for completing the Wolff property clean up on Telegraph.

### ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Bryan Richison – Stated that he truly appreciates the staff and volunteers who worked so tirelessly through the flood. Mr. Richison stated we ask a lot of our employees that many other municipal employees don't have to deal with, in regards to flooding events, and our employees always come through. We also need to keep finding ways to improve and look at any type of preventative measure options, as the floods will keep coming.

Chief Shockey – Thanked the staff and department heads for all their hard work. He also stated that having the three days to prepare helped greatly.

**Dickie Brown** – Stated that as a new person coming in he was extremely impressed with how the City handled the flooding event. He was in awe of the dedication of the employees and volunteers. The Recreation Center has distributed a lot of cleaning supplies and they are ready for the Farmers Market to be held there this Saturday. Parks and Recreation will be moving into the park to begin clean up and there was limited damage at the golf course.

Ed Blattner – Stated public works did a great job getting sand out to residents and we will now have several months of clean up.

Mary Holden – Thanked staff and the Fire Department for a job well done. There were approximately 46 homes that had electricity shut off and by Friday 40 were back on. Christie Hull-Bettale is out performing damage assessments for FEMA. Also, the new city limits sign should be installed shortly.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Jason Fulbright. Seconded by EJ Fleischmann. Voice vote: All yeas.

This is an ordinance amendment for the M1 and M2 Industrial Districts.

### **ANALYSIS**

Staff has noticed some inconsistencies with regard to the Industrial zoning district compared to the Commercial regulations. This revision was brought to Commission for discussion and comments at a previous meeting. With that said, staff has prepared the amended ordinance. It is attached.

Public notice was advertised and hearing was held at the April 25, 2017 Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. There was no public comment. The Planning Commission forwards recommendation of approval (7 yea - 0 nay) to City Council for acceptance of the ordinance.

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 405: DISTRICT REGULATIONS 405.350.6 & 405.360.G FOR THE M-1 & M-2 INDUSTRIAL DISTRICTS, OFFSTREET PARKING AND LOADING REQUIREMENTS

WHEREAS, the proper public hearing has been held, pursuant to City Ordinance and the laws of the State of Missouri, and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that these amendments will not be detrimental and Planning Commission is recommending these updates; and this change is in the best interest of the City of Arnold.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1a. Chapter 405, Section 405.350, 6-a; Specific Standard is hereby amended by the below:

- 6. Off-street parking and loading requirements.
- a) Except as otherwise provided in this Subsection, the requirements for offstreet parking shall be implemented with regard to the minimum dimensions in the following table:

- i) A stall dimension of nine (9) feet by eighteen (18) feet or equivalent may be utilized for off-street parking stalls provided in excess of the minimum requirements as set forth in this Section when designated for compact car use.
- j) Trash receptacles shall be located on-site, out of the path of vehicular and pedestrian circulation, and screened by a sight-proof fence that is complimentary to the material of the primary building. When a commercial site is adjacent to residential, the trash receptacle shall not be located adjacent to the residential.

Section 2a. Chapter 405, Section 405.360, G-1; Specific Standard is hereby amended by the below:

- G. Off-street parking and loading requirements.
- 1. Except as otherwise provided in this Subsection, the requirements for offstreet parking shall be implemented with regard to the minimum dimensions in the following table:

- 8. A stall dimension of nine (9) feet by eighteen (18) feet or equivalent may be utilized for off-street parking stalls provided in excess of the minimum requirements as set forth in this Section when designated for compact car use.
- 9. Trash receptacles shall be located on-site, out of the path of vehicular and pedestrian circulation, and screened by a sight-proof fence that is complimentary to the material of the primary building. When a commercial site is adjacent to residential, the trash receptacle shall not be located adjacent to the residential.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

## GENERAL SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI AND GEORGE BUTLER ASSOCIATES (GBA) FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR BRIDGE REPAIR PROJECTS

This General Service AGREEMENT (AGREEMENT) is entered into between THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI (CITY) AND GEORGE BUTLER ASSOCIATES (GBA), for the following reasons:

- 1. CITY requires services for CITY Bridge Repair Projects; and,
- 2. GBA is prepared to provide the Services.

In consideration of the promises contained in this AGREEMENT, CITY and GBA agree as follows:

#### **ARTICLE 1 - EFFECTIVE DATE**

The effective date of this AGREEMENT shall be this 18 day of May, 2017.

#### **ARTICLE 2 - GOVERNING LAW**

This AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri.

#### ARTICLE 3 - SCOPE OF SERVICES

The CITY shall identify potential projects under this AGREEMENT by issuing Notice To Proceed requests for all four bridge project. Notice To Proceed may be issued to GBA by the CITY either verbally or email.

GBA Scope of services is attached as addendum "A"...

#### **ARTICLE 4 - SCHEDULE**

Reference Addendum "A".

#### **ARTICLE 5 - COMPENSATION**

The CITY shall pay GBA in accordance with the attached Addendum "A".

GBA shall submit periodic statements for Services rendered. If CITY objects to any statement submitted by GBA, CITY shall so advise GBA in writing giving reasons therefor within fourteen days (14) of receipt of such statement. If no such objection is made, the statement will be considered acceptable to CITY. At a minimum, all invoices shall include the following specific information: a unique invoice number; an itemized statement of the work performed; and a statement of amounts previously billed, amount of the current invoice, and total amount billed to date.

CITY shall pay GBA within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoice.

## **ARTICLE 6 - SUBCONTRACTING**

No part of the services to be performed by GBA hereunder shall be subcontracted without the prior written consent of the CITY. The subcontracting of the work shall in no way relieve GBA of the primary responsibility for the quality and performance of the work. GBA shall assure that any Subconsultants as provided for herein, is in full compliance with all laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, provisions of this AGREEMENT, and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, compliance with all federal laws applicable to contracts of this type.

#### **ARTICLE 7 - INDEMNIFICATION**

GBA shall indemnify and hold harmless CITY from and against all judgments, losses, damages, and expenses (including attorney fees and defense costs) to the extent such judgments, losses, damages, or expenses are caused by any negligent act, error, or omission of GBA or any person or organization for whom GBA is legally liable.

#### **ARTICLE 8 - INSURANCE**

During the performance of the Services under this AGREEMENT, GBA shall maintain the following insurance with carriers having a Best's rating of at least B+ and authorized to do business in the state in which the Services are being performed:

(a) General Liability Insurance on a coverage form equal to ISO CG 00 01, on an occurrence basis, with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate, including a per-project

- endorsement.
- (b) Automobile Liability Insurance to include coverage for all hired, owned and non-owned vehicles, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000.
- (c) Workers' Compensation Insurance, in accordance with the laws of the state in which the Services are being performed, and Employers' Liability Insurance with limits according to such statutory requirements, or \$500,000 for each accident, whichever is greater. Where Services fall within the authority of the United States Longshoreman's and Harbor Workers Compensation Act, or the Jones Act, GBA's insurance shall include such Acts.
- (d) Professional Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per claim and annual aggregate.
- (e) GBA shall provide and maintain the following if applicable to the Services:
  - i. When operations related to the Services hereunder will involve subsurface investigation (such as soil samples, core drilling, test wells, etc.), GBA, or its subcontractor(s) as applicable, shall maintain Contractor's Pollution Liability Insurance, including bodily injury, property damage and cleanup costs, with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and annual aggregate.
  - ii. When necessary for GBA to use watercraft for the performance of the Services under this AGREEMENT, and if excluded by GBA's General Liability policy, GBA shall maintain a Watercraft Liability policy with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage, including protection & indemnity where applicable. Coverage will apply to owned, non-owned and hired watercraft.
  - iii. When necessary for GBA to use aircraft (fixed-wing or rotary) for the performance of the Services under this AGREEMENT, GBA shall maintain Aircraft Liability with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage, including passenger liability. Coverage will apply to owned, non-owned and hired aircraft.

The policies shall provide, or be endorsed to provide, that: (1) at least thirty (30) days' advance written notice shall be given to CITY prior to cancellation or non-renewal, (2) the CITY shall be added as additional insureds under policies listed under (a), (b) and (e) above.

Upon request, GBA shall furnish CITY certificates of insurance and required endorsement(s) which evidence the requirements of this Article prior to performing any Services under this AGREEMENT. GBA further agrees to file new certificates showing renewal of coverage and limits at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the current policies.

#### **ARTICLE 9 - INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR**

GBA undertakes performance of the Services as an independent contractor and shall be wholly responsible for the methods of performance. GBA has complete and sole responsibility for its employees, agents, subcontractors or any other persons or entity that GBA hires to perform or assist in performing the Services hereunder. GBA is solely responsible for (a) payment of wages, benefits, and other compensation to or for its employees, (b) payment of applicable payroll, unemployment, and other taxes and withholding of applicable social security (FICA) and income taxes with respect to its employees, and (c) compliance with applicable Workers' Compensation laws with respect to maintenance of workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance coverages.

#### **ARTICLE 10 - COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS**

In performance of the Services, GBA shall comply with applicable regulatory requirements including federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, orders, codes, criteria, and standards. GBA shall procure the permits, certificates, and licenses necessary to allow GBA to perform the Services. GBA shall not be responsible for procuring permits, certificates, and licenses required for any construction unless such responsibilities are specifically assigned to GBA in the Scope of Services.

#### **ARTICLE 11 - CITY'S RESPONSIBILITIES**

CITY shall perform the following in a timely manner so as not to delay the Services of GBA:

- (a) Provide criteria and information pertinent to GBA 's Services as to CITY's requirements for the Project, including design objectives and constraints, space, capacity, and performance requirements, flexibility and expandability, and any budgetary limitations; and furnish copies of all design and construction standards which CITY will require to be included in the drawings and specifications to be furnished by GBA under this AGREEMENT, if any.
- (b) Make available to GBA drawings, specifications, schedules, and other information, interpretations, and data which are prepared by CITY, or by others, which CITY and GBA consider pertinent to GBA 's responsibilities hereunder.
- (c) Arrange for access to and to make provisions for GBA to enter upon public and private property as required

for GBA to perform the Services.

(d) Give prompt notice to GBA whenever CITY observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of GBA 's Services.

Unless otherwise provided in the AGREEMENT, the information and services to be provided by CITY under this Article will be without cost to GBA.

#### **ARTICLE 12 - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS**

All documents, including, but not limited to, drawings, specifications, computer software and other such instruments of service prepared by GBA pursuant to this AGREEMENT, whether completed or in progress, are the property of CITY. Ownership shall transfer to CITY if or as required by the Prime AGREEMENT. Any use except for the specific purpose intended by this AGREEMENT will be at the user's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to GBA.

#### **ARTICLE 13 - TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION**

The CITY may terminate this AGREEMENT at any time, with or without cause, effective upon delivery of Written Notice thereof to GBA.

Should the AGREEMENT be so terminated, all drawings and documents in connection with the project shall become the property of the CITY who shall, in that event, make reasonable allowance for expenses incurred and services satisfactorily performed by GBA to the date of termination. The CITY shall indemnify GBA for any use or re-use of plans by persons with CITY's express approval.

#### **ARTICLE 14 - PROPRIETARY INFORMATION**

GBA shall treat as proprietary all information provided by CITY and all drawings, reports, studies, design calculations, specifications, and other documents or information, in any form or media, resulting from the GBA 's performance of the Services. GBA shall not publish or disclose proprietary information for any purpose other than the performance of the Services without the prior written authorization of CITY.

The preceding restriction shall not apply to information which is in the public domain, was previously known to GBA, was acquired by GBA from others who have no confidential relationship to CITY with respect to same, or which, through no fault of GBA, comes into the public domain. GBA shall not be restricted from releasing information, including proprietary information, in response to a subpoena, court order, or other legal process. GBA shall not be required to resist such subpoena, court order, or legal process, but shall promptly notify CITY in writing of the demand for information before GBA responds to such demand. CITY may, at its sole discretion, seek to quash such demand.

#### **ARTICLE 15 - NOTICES**

Any notices required by this AGREEMENT shall be made in writing to the address specified below:

Nothing contained in this Article shall be construed to restrict the transmission of routine communications between representatives of CITY and GBA.

#### **ARTICLE 16 - DELAY IN PERFORMANCE**

Neither CITY nor GBA shall be considered in default of this AGREEMENT for delays in performance caused by circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the nonperforming party. For purposes of this AGREEMENT, such circumstances include, but are not limited to, abnormal weather conditions; floods; earthquakes; fire; epidemics; war, riots, and other civil disturbances; strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns, and other labor disturbances; sabotage; judicial restraint; and delay in or inability to procure permits, licenses, or authorizations from any local, state or federal agency for any of the supplies, materials, accesses, or services required to be provided by either CITY or GBA under this AGREEMENT.

Should such circumstances occur, the nonperforming party shall, within a reasonable time of being prevented from performing, give written notice to the other party, describing the circumstances preventing continued performance and the efforts being made to resume performance.

#### **ARTICLE 17 - DISPUTES**

In the event of a dispute between CITY and GBA arising out of or related to this AGREEMENT, the aggrieved party shall notify the other party of the dispute within a reasonable time after such dispute arises. If the parties cannot thereafter resolve the dispute, each party shall nominate a senior officer of its management to meet to resolve the dispute by direct negotiation or mediation.

Should such negotiation or mediation fail to resolve the dispute, either party may pursue resolution by arbitration in accordance with the Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association; provided, however, in the event the parties are unable to reach AGREEMENT to arbitrate under terms reasonably acceptable to both parties, either party may pursue resolution in any court having jurisdiction.

During the pendency of any dispute, the parties shall continue diligently to fulfill their respective obligations hereunder.

#### **ARTICLE 18 - RECORDS**

GBA's records pertaining to compensation and payments under this AGREEMENT shall be kept in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Such records shall be subject to audit by CITY, during normal business hours at GBA's place of business, or GBA shall provide a copy of same to CITY at CITY's expense. GBA shall not dispose of the originals of such records until after sixty (60) days' prior written notice to CITY.

#### **ARTICLE 19 - EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY**

GBA and any Subconsultants will, in all solicitation, or advertisements for employees and for all WORK performed by employees of GBA or under a subconsultant including procurement of services, equipment, or materials, comply with all provisions of State and Federal laws and regulations governing the Americans with Disabilities Act, Equal Employment Opportunity and Non-Discrimination.

#### **ARTICLE 20 - WAIVER**

A waiver by either CITY or GBA of any breach of this AGREEMENT shall be in writing. Such a waiver shall not affect the waiving party's rights with respect to any other or further breach.

#### **ARTICLE 21 - SEVERABILITY**

The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this AGREEMENT or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this AGREEMENT void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this AGREEMENT. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this AGREEMENT, and the balance of this AGREEMENT shall be construed and enforced as if it did not contain the particular portion or provision held to be void. CITY and GBA further agree to amend this AGREEMENT to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this Article shall not prevent this entire AGREEMENT from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this AGREEMENT be determined void.

## **ARTICLE 22 - INTEGRATION**

This AGREEMENT, including any Attachments incorporated by reference in the AGREEMENT, represents the entire and integrated AGREEMENT between CITY and GBA. It supersedes all prior and contemporaneous communications, representations, and AGREEMENTs, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this AGREEMENT. This AGREEMENT may be amended only by a written instrument signed by both CITY and GBA.

#### **ARTICLE 23 - SUBCONTRACTING**

GBA shall not engage independent consultants, associates, or subcontractors to assist in the performance of GBA 's Services without the prior written consent of CITY.

#### **ARTICLE 24 - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS**

CITY and GBA each binds itself and its successors, executors, administrators, permitted assigns, legal representatives, and, in the case of a partnership, its partners, to the other party to this AGREEMENT and to the successors, executors, administrators, permitted assigns, legal representatives, and partners of such other party, in respect to all provisions of this AGREEMENT.

#### **ARTICLE 25 - ASSIGNMENTS**

Neither CITY nor GBA shall assign any rights or duties under this AGREEMENT without the prior written consent of the other party; provided, however, GBA may assign its rights to payment without CITY's consent. Unless otherwise stated in the written consent, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any obligation under this AGREEMENT.

## **ARTICLE 26 - THIRD PARTY RIGHTS**

The Services provided for in this AGREEMENT are for the sole use and benefit of, and nothing in this AGREEMENT shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to, anyone other than the CITY and GBA.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, CITY and GBA have executed this AGREEMENT. The individuals signing this AGREEMENT represent and warrant that they have the power and authority to enter into this AGREEMENT and bind the parties for whom they sign.

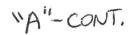

Bill Knittig is the chairperson for the Arnold Commission on Aging and Disabilities. This commission has been active since 2002 and has provided guidance and recommendations to the city of Arnold; specific to needs for those aging or those with developmental disabilities. Bill along with the other members of the commission will be overseeing the completion of the five (5) step process identified for members of the AARP and World Health Organization network of age-friendly cities and communities. The commission's purpose includes: determining the needs of the citizens with disabilities or those aging, make recommendations in regards to state and federal changes, identify and make recommendations to the city council (could involve changes to city ordinances, the development of new ordinance, and / or the adoption of resolutions), and provide information or resources as needed to the city administrators and the community, specific to aging & disability services.

## Section 3: COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES, ENGAGEMENTS and COLLABORATIONS

1) Please provide a brief summary of the community policies, programs and services that are targeted toward older people and how the community plans to become more age-friendly.

In respect to outdoor spaces and buildings, the city has several parks in which the walking trails are paved and have seating capacity at equally spaced intervals. The city recreation center hosts the "silver sneakers" program as well as the community Senior Center. Arnold is the only city in Jefferson County, Missouri that has a public transportation system specifically for our city. Through collaboration with a local developer and a state organized independent living center; 2 different senior housing complexes have opened within the city limits in the past 7 years. The city is in the process of developing a guide for contractors specific to "universal design" and these contractors will be enrouraged to develop a percentage of homes using these methods, thus allowing a person to age in place. The city provides facilities for an annual Senior Expo and sponsors an annual All Ability Expo; which provides resources and supports to those who are aging as well as those with a disability. Annual utility rebates are provided to those who qualify due to age. Information is shared on a regular basis through the city website, newsletter, and newspaper letter (quarterly basis). City street signs are being replaced with signage that includes both upper and lower case lettering in front of a more reflective background, thus making it easier for those aging.

## 2) How will the community engage and involve older people in the process of becoming a more agefriendly?

Current positions for the Commission on Aging and Disabilities include: (1) a representative for the aging community and (2) a representative from a provider agency who serves the aging population. In addition to this representation, the commission regularly seeks input from the population(s) identified to be served, through surveys, open meetings, brochures, etc. As a part of the planning process, the commission will host community meetings to gather information. These meetings will be held in collaboration with the Mideast Area Agency on Aging. We will also gather information by sponsoring a table / booth at the annual Senior Expo.

## 3) Briefly describe the mechanisms the community has or is planning to put in place to facilitate collaborative planning and implementation between different agencies and departments.

Agencies which the city of Arnold is presently collaborating with or have collaborated with in past projects include: the Mideast Area Agency on Aging, Disability Resource Association, Jeffferson County Developmental Disabilities Resource Board, Fox C-6 School District, Rock Community Fire Protection District, Rock Township Ambulance District, Jeffco Express Transportation System, COMTREA (area mental health provider), Jefferson County Health Department, University of Missouri Extension Center and the Arnold Food Pantry. This collaboration has resulted in some of the following actions: letter of support for state legislation for continuing the property tax credit for the elderly and those with disabilities, advised the city on their ADA plan, recommended the Smoking ordinance for the city, provided data which led to the funding of the city route for Jeffco Express (public transportation system), the passing of a city resolution to use "People First" language, and the development of 911 form for Arnold Police to utilize to identify special needs for those who are aging or have a disability.

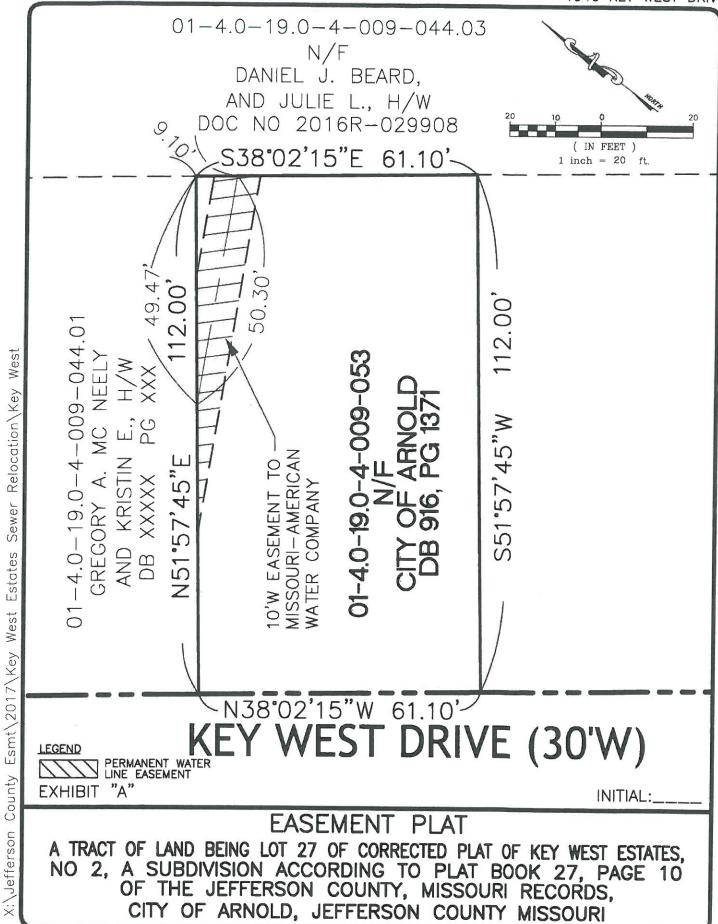

Grantee may from time to time enter upon said premises to construct, reconstruct, replace, maintain, or repair the Sewer System and may assign its rights herein granted to the state, county, city or other political subdivisions of the State. Grantee shall also have the right to clear and keep clear brush, trees, shrubbery, roots and other obstructions of which, in Grantee's judgment, may interfere with the safe, proper and expeditious laying, construction, maintenance, alteration, inspection, repair, replacement, protection, relocation, operation and removal of said Sewer System.

Grantee, its successors and assigns, shall have the right to use and control the Sewer System for the collection and transportation of waste water effluent from public or private sources through the above described property and for all proper purposes connected with the installation, use, maintenance, and replacement of a line or lines of sewer piping, and with the attachment thereto of the service lines of its customers. 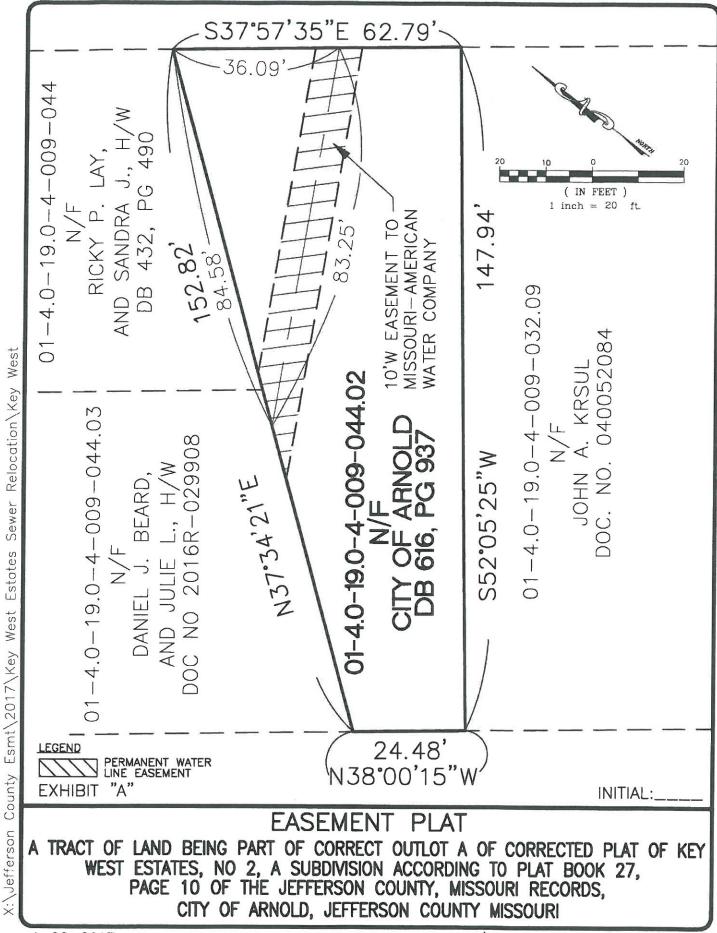
