### YELLOW HEART MEMORIAL

Megan Wagner, representative for the Missouri Chapter of the Yellow Heart Memorial, spoke to council regarding the organization, which is a not for profit that places memorials to those who lost their lives to COVID-19. Ms. Wagner became involved with the organization after her father lost his battle with COVID-19. She has been working with Allison Sweeney and city staff to develop a plan to place a memorial at the Arnold Rec Center. Bryan Richison supplied council with the quote from Warren Sign, who will fabricate and install the memorial sign. The initial quote also includes the first 128 plaques that would house each name of the person to be memorialized. Questions and comments followed by council, who indicated their desire to see this project move forward.

# **2022 BUDGET**

Bryan Richison provided council with a summary of the proposed 2022 annual budget for the General Fund, Recreation Center Fund, Storm Water Fund and Tourism Fund. Mr. Richison also informed council of the "Wish List" items he is recommending for approval, along with a list of items he is not recommending for each department. After discussion from council, Mr. Richison will add one "Wish List" item from the Recreation Center Fund, which is to replace the outdoor pool spray pad and wall. # **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

A City-initiated request to amend Chapter 535 Swimming Pools to replace all references to "Health Officer" with "Code Enforcement Officer" Additional minor verbiage changes are included to match tense and to clarify language.

# **REVIEW & ANALYSIS:**

As part of the Community Development Department's ongoing reorganization, the administration and enforcement of Chapter 535 Swimming Pools is being managed by the Code Enforcement Officer, which will fall under the responsibilities of the Building Commissioner.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends approval of the draft ordinance attached hereto.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 535 (SWIMMING POOLS) OF THE ARNOLD CODE ORDINANCES BY ADDING A DEFINITION FOR CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER AND REPLACING ALL REFERENCES TO HEALTH OFFICER AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT WITH SAME.

WHEREAS, the Arnold City Council desires to amend Chapter 220 (General Nuisances) of the City of Arnold Code of Ordinances as provided herein;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: Section 535.020, *Definitions*, is hereby amended by deleting the definitions for "Community Development Department" and "Health Officer."

**SECTION 2:** Section 535.020, *Definitions*, is hereby amended by adding the following:

# "CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

The Building Commissioner or his/her designee."

**SECTION 3:** Chapter 535, *Swimming Pools*, is hereby amended by the deletion and replacement of all references to "Health Officer" with "Code Enforcement Officer".

**SECTION 4:** Chapter 535, *Swimming Pools*, is hereby amended by the deletion and replacement of all references to "Health Department" with "Code Enforcement Officer".

<u>SECTION 5</u>: For purposes of correcting grammar and punctuation, Section 535.060 is hereby amended by its deletion and replacement in its entirety with the following:

# "Section 535.060 License to Operate.

No person shall operate or maintain a swimming pool, bathing place or water slide until a license therefor shall have been issued by the Code Enforcement Officer or that officer's duly authorized agents, which license shall not be valid for longer than one (1) year from the date of issuance. A new license must be secured on or before May fifteenth (15th) of each year which will permit operation or maintenance until the following May fifteenth (15th). All licenses shall be in writing and shall state the conditions thereof and the term for which the license is granted. It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct, operate, maintain or manage any swimming pool, bathing place or water slide without complying with the requirements of this Chapter; and the Code Enforcement Officer is charged with the administering and enforcing licensing provisions of this Chapter. The Code Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized to promulgate rules and regulations for the construction, operation and maintenance of swimming pools, bathing places and water slides for the protection and promotion of the public health, safety, morals and public welfare."

**SECTION 6:** For purposes of correcting grammar and punctuation, Section 535.120 is hereby amended by its deletion and replacement in its entirety with the following:

"Section 535.120 Discharge of Water.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge water from a pool except in compliance with the following provisions:
  - 1. Water shall only be discharged into a sanitary sewer.
  - 2. In the event that sanitary sewers are not available, water from pools shall be discharged in such locations, and in such a manner, as authorized by the Code Enforcement Officer."

**SECTION 7:** Saving clause. That nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any right acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing under any act or ordinance hereby repealed, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

**SECTION 8:** If any part of this Ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or any part thereof and said Ordinance shall be read as if said invalid provision was struck therefrom and the context thereof changed accordingly with the remainder of the Ordinance to be and remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 9:** All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

**WHEREAS**, the Arnold City Council desires to amend Chapter 220 (General Nuisances) of the City of Arnold Code of Ordinances as provided herein;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** Section 220.010, *Definitions*, is hereby amended by adding the following:

# "CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

The Building Commissioner or his/her designee."

**SECTION 2:** Section 220.030, *Definitions*, is hereby amended by adding the following:

# "CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

The Building Commissioner or his/her designee."

**SECTION 3:** Section 220.240, *Definitions*, is hereby amended by adding the following:

# "CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

The Building Commissioner or his/her designee."

**SECTION 4:** Chapter 220, *General Nuisances*, is hereby amended by the deletion and replacement of all references to "Health Officer" with "Code Enforcement Officer".

**SECTION 5:** Saving clause. That nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any right acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing under any act or ordinance hereby repealed, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

**SECTION 6:** If any part of this Ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or any part thereof and said Ordinance shall be read as if said invalid provision was struck therefrom and the context thereof changed accordingly with the remainder of the Ordinance to be and remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 7:** All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

**SECTION 8:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

A City-initiated request to delete Chapter 225 Health and Sanitation in its entirety, because regulations contained therein are duplicative of regulations contained in the ICC International Swimming Pool & Spa Code and the International Property Maintenance Code.

# **REVIEW & ANALYSIS:**

As part of the Community Development Department's ongoing reorganization, the administration and enforcement of Chapter 225 Health and Sanitation is being managed by the Code Enforcement Officer, which will fall under the responsibilities of the Building Commissioner. Upon examination, it was discovered the language contained in the Chapter, which only covers public swimming pools (i.e. those pools operated by hotels, gyms, HOAs, etc.) is unnecessary, because it duplicates regulations contained in the adopted Building Code (i.e. the International Swimming Pool & Spa Code and the International Property Maintenance Code).

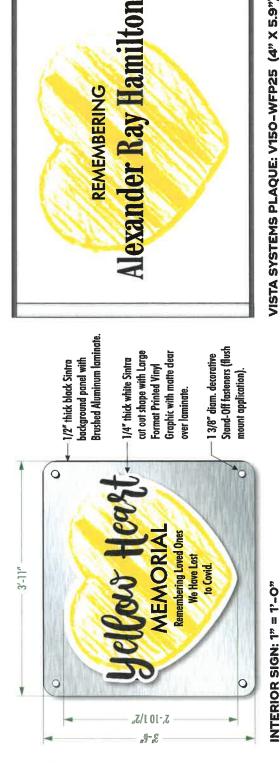

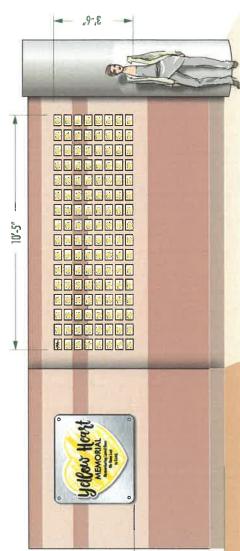

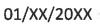
