BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Tom Dohack, 105 Pistis – Stated he is a Trustee for Maxville Gardens Subdivision and is against Resolution 18-03 regarding authorization for the City Administrator to execute change orders with JM Marchuetz for the NID project. Mr. Dohack believes trustees should review and approve any type of change orders before council approves them.

Mike Evans, 509 Hannah Way – Would like to see Republic Services offer some type of rebate on trash fees for veterans, low income homes and seniors.

Joe Flannigan, Elsberry, MO – Stated he is at the meeting representing the owners of 607 Christ Drive, Mr. and Mrs. Pridy. They believe they meet all criteria set to be able to sell the property as a 4 family unit.

John Thomas, 3142 Arnold Tenbrook – Stated his mother owns 600 Christ. They do not want the Conditional Use Permit to be approved at 607 Christ Drive.

Vicki Shoults, 627 Dornseif – Stated she does not want the Conditional Use Permit to be approved for 607 Christ. The owners do not keep quality tenants in the building and she does not believe it should have ever been allowed to become a 4 family unit.

Carol Talley, 618 Dornseif – Stated she is against the Conditional Use Permit for 607 Christ. She stated that over the years there have been many complaints about the property.

Susan Blust, 608 Christ – Lives directly across from 607 Christ and stated that even though the new owners could fix up the property, that doesn't guarantee the types of people they will rent to.

Patrick Sanfilippo, 617 Dornseif – Stated he is against the Conditional Use Permit being approved. He always has trash issues with the renters and people on his property at all hours of the day. There are also cars coming and going all the time there.

Conrad Marsala, 630 Dornseif – Stated he is against the Conditional Use Permit being approved. He assisted in acquiring signatures for the petition that was submitted to the City. He doesn't see how it could be approved when all the residents in the area are against it.

ORDINANCE NO.	
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AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ASSIGNMENT OF CERTAIN RIGHTS HELD BY THE CITY TO ITS WORKERS' COMPENSATION CARRIER.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any prior agreements or any ordinance to the contrary, the City of Arnold transfers any and all rights and obligations afforded by 287.140 and 287.140.10 to the Missouri Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (MIRMA) for any workers' compensation claims for which MIRMA has an obligation to provide coverage to the City of Arnold and indemnity or benefits to any past, current or former employee(s) of the City of Arnold pursuant to Chapter 287 RSMo or any policy of workers' compensation coverage. The assignment of rights to MIRMA afforded by this ordinance, including, but not limited to selection of the healthcare provider(s) will remain in force for any workers' compensation claim currently open and newly reported during the City's period of membership, or until this agreement is revoked. Should this ordinance be repealed or this agreement terminated, any assignment of rights addressed herein shall survive such repeal or termination for any and all claims reported to MIRMA prior to such repeal or revocation. Should the City of Arnold choose to assert any right which has been transferred to MIRMA, it shall be obligated to reimburse MIRMA for any losses suffered as a result of medical expenses paid by MIRMA on behalf of an employee that is receiving benefits under a policy of workers' compensation coverage between MIRMA and the City of Arnold for treatment that is not received by the injured worker as a result of the City of Arnold's selection of medical care.

<u>Section 2</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Exhibit A Contract Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT, made and concluded this <u>22nd</u> day of <u>December</u> 2017, by and between <u>J.M. Marschuetz Construction Co.</u> hereinafter called the "Contractor", and the City of Arnold, Missouri, hereinafter called the "City".

WITNESSETH, THAT, whereas the Council of the City of Arnold by motion adopted at a meeting held on <u>December 21, 2017</u>, and by virtue of authority vested in said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

Article 1. SCOPE OF WORK:

The Contractor shall provide all work incidental to the furnishing of all material, equipment, and labor to undertake the MAXVILLE GARDENS SUBDIVISION PROJECT in accordance with the project specifications, and the terms of this contract for the City of Arnold, Missouri.

The Owner shall have representatives at the site as he may decide during the construction to observe the work in progress.

Article 2. TIME OF COMPLETION:

Work on the MAXVILLE GARDENS SUBDIVISION PROJECT must begin on <u>January 1, 2017</u> and shall be carried on at a rate to secure its full completion by <u>May 31, 2018</u>. This date may be adjusted by the Public Works Director as additions and/or deletions are made but under no instances shall this agreement or completion date extend beyond 6 months from the date of the contract.

DEDUCTIONS FOR NOT COMPLETING ON TIME

It is mutually understood and agreed that time is the essence of this Agreement and in the event said work is not completed on or before the date named above for its completion, the Contractor shall pay damages to the owner of Two Hundred & Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per day. Those damages shall be used to pay the expenses of the inspectors and the services of the Public Works Director for the extra time required for the completion of the work. Extra time shall in all cases be construed as the time required for completion after the date herein named. Extensions of time granted by the Owner for completion of the Contract on account of fire, strikes, or acts of Providence shall not be construed as extra time. The amount of such expense and services shall be determined by the Public Works Director, shall be reported to him in writing to the Owner, and shall be withheld from any money due the Contractor and paid to the proper parties.

Where any deductions from or forfeitures of payment in connection with the work on this Contract are duly and properly declared or imposed against the Contractor in accordance with the terms of this contract, state laws, or ordinances of the City, the total amount thereof may be withheld from any money whatsoever due or to become due the Contractor under the Contract, and when deducted shall be deemed and taken as payment in such amount.

Article 3. CONTRACT PRICE:

The City shall pay to the Contractor for the performance of the work a sum not to exceed the total cost as shown on Contractor's bid of October 31, 2017 attached hereto as Addendum "A".

Work covered under these criteria shall consist of all material, labor, equipment and services necessary for the MAXVILLE GARDENS SUBDIVISION PROJECT.

Quantities may be added or deleted at any time during the contact. This contract is based on a quantity at a unit cost.

The above unit cost provided in this agreement proposal shall be guaranteed for the duration of contract.

Article 4. PAYMENTS TO CONTRACTOR:

- a. At least twenty (20) days before the City Council meeting at which the progress payment shall be presented for approval (but not more often than once a month), the Contractor will submit to the City a partial payment estimate filled out and signed by the Contractor covering the work performed during the period covered by the partial payment estimate and supported by such data as the City may reasonably require. The City will, within ten (10) days following the first regular Council meeting at which the pay request can be put on the Council meeting agenda, pay the Contractor a progress payment on the basis of the approved partial payment estimate. Regular Council meetings are held on first and third Thursdays of each month and the agenda for the Council meeting is set seven (7) days prior to each meeting. The City shall retain five percent (5%) of the amount of each payment until final completion and acceptance of all work covered by the Contract Documents. Authorized extra work shall be included in these monthly progress payments.
- b. No payment shall be made for materials delivered or stored on the site.
- c. When the work provided for under this Contract has been fully completed in accordance with the terms thereof, the City shall make a final inspection and the Contractor shall remedy any defects arising out of said inspection. After final acceptance of the work by the City, final payment shall be made based on the price stated in Article 3.
 - From the final payment shall be retained all monies expended by the City according to the terms of this Contract, and thereunder chargeable to the Contractor, all monies payable to the City, as liquidated damages, and all deductions provided by Contract, State Laws, or Ordinances of the City of Arnold.
- d. The Contractor will indemnify and save the City or the City's agents harmless from all claims growing out of the lawful demands of subcontractors, laborers, workers, mechanics, furnisher of material, and furnisher of machinery and parts thereof, equipment, tools, and all supplies, incurred in the furtherance of the performance of the work. The Contractor shall, at the City's request, furnish satisfactory evidence that all obligations of the nature designated above have been paid, discharged, or waived. If the Contractor fails to do so, the City may, after having notified the Contractor, either pay unpaid bills or withhold from the Contractor's unpaid compensation a sum until satisfactory evidence is furnished that all liabilities have been fully discharged, whereupon payment to the Contractor shall be made, in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents, but in no event shall the provisions of this sentence be construed to impose any obligations upon the City to either the Contractor, his Surety, or any third party. In paying any unpaid bills of the Contractor, any payment so made by the City shall be considered

as a payment made under the Contract Documents by the City to the Contractor and the City shall not be liable to the Contractor for any such payments made in good faith.

Article 5. GUARANTEE:

The Contractor and his Surety hereby expressly guarantee the aforesaid work as to workmanship and quality of materials used in connection therewith, for a period of one year, commencing on the date of acceptance of the work or improvements, and binds himself, his successors or assigns, to make all replacements which may become necessary within that time due to nonconformity with the Specifications. Whenever notified by the City that said replacements are required, the Contractor shall, at once, make the same as directed, and at his own expense. If the Contractor does not proceed with such replacements within five (5) days of receipt of written notice, then the City shall have the power to cause the same to be made and to charge the cost thereof to the Contractor. Nothing in this Section is intended as a maintenance guarantee.

Article 6. INSURANCE:

The Contractor will be required to furnish Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance in amounts as specified in the General Conditions and coverage to name the City of Arnold, Missouri, in addition to the Contractor, so that the City of Arnold is not only protected from all claims but also protected in that legal service will be rendered to defend all suits against the Contractor and the City. The Contractor shall be required to furnish the City with satisfactory proof of carriage of the insurance and endorsement(s) required.

Article 7. STATUTORY AND REGULATORY COMPLIANCE:

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure compliance with all federal, state and local requirements, including, but not limited to, the following Revised Statutes of the State of Missouri:

285.530 RSMo: Work Authorization 292.675 RSMo. OSHA Training. RSMo. 34.353 et seq. American Products. 290-210 Prevailing Wage

The above list is not intended to be exhaustive; and the compliance requirement of this provision is continuing and must be satisfied during the entirety of this Agreement.

It is the sole responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that this provision is satisfied; and the City assumes no responsibility or liability for the failure to comply. Any penalty incurred as a result of noncompliance or failure to comply will be borne solely by the Contractor.

Article 8. THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS: The Advertisement, Information for Bidders, the Specifications, including Addenda Nos. _____, _____, and _____, the Bid, and Bond, together with this Agreement, form the Contract. 



ARNOLD DAYS TENT AGREEMENT

Agreement made _____ day of _____, 2018, by and between the City of Arnold, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, with its principal office at 2101 Jeffco Blvd., Arnold Missouri 63010 (hereinafter referred to as "Arnold" or "City") and Fund Ways of Missouri, LLC, a Missouri Limited Liability Corporation, with its principal office at 5118 Blase Station Road, Saint Charles, Missouri 63301 (hereinafter referred to as "FWM").

- 1. **Purpose**. FWM shall furnish, erect, maintain and disassemble the prescribed number and size of tents for the celebration sponsored by Arnold known as Arnold Days. Arnold reserves the right to amend the quantity and size of tents by written notification not less than thirty (30) days prior to the event's start date. Amendments shall warrant reconsideration of service fees. Fee adjustment shall be in writing.
 - a. Seven (7) 10 feet by 10 feet white tents with weight buckets;
 - b. One (1) 10 feet by 30 feet with tent weight buckets;
 - c. One (1) 10 feet by 40 feet with tent weight buckets;
 - d. Three (3) 20 feet by 60 feet tents in asphalt staking.
- 2. Location, Dates & Time. The tent locations shall be at Arnold City Park. The exact locations, dates and times may be changed by mutual agreement of the parties. The Arnold Days dates are as follows:

September 14-16, 2018

September 20-22, 2019

September 18-20, 2020

FWM may begin setting up tents at 8:00 a.m. on the Thursday before the opening of the Arnold Days. Earlier tent setup may be permitted with mutual agreement of the parties. FWM shall have the tents completely removed, from the site, by 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday following the close of the Arnold Days event.

3. Term of Contract. This Agreement shall remain in effect from September 1, 2018, through September 30, 2020. Either party may terminate this agreement by providing written notice of termination within the sixty (60) day period following the close of Arnold Days for any year this Agreement is in effect. In the event written notice is not provided within one of the required sixty (60) day periods, this Agreement may only be terminated by the parties' mutual written agreement.

- **4. Payments.** In consideration of the above, Arnold agrees to pay FWM the following compensation:
 - a. 2018 Arnold Days Four-Thousand and Fifty Dollars (\$4,050.00)
 - b. 2019 Arnold Days Four-Thousand and Fifty Dollars (\$4,050.00)
 - c. 2020 Arnold Days Four-Thousand and Fifty Dollars (\$4,050.00)
 - 5. Arnold's Responsibilities. Arnold shall do the following:
 - a. Supply the event and tent locations;
 - b. Obtain all necessary mass gathering permits required by Jefferson County or the State of Missouri;
 - c. Grant any business license necessary from the City for fulfillment of the contract without charging the normal business or other license fee; and

6. FWM Responsibilities.

Employees:

- a. FWM shall provide Arnold with an executed Background Affidavit of Public Safety Due Diligence no less than seventy-two (72) hours prior to event setup each year for the duration of the agreement. Arnold reserves the right to prohibit any FWM employee from accessing City property.
- b. FWM shall require all of its employees and representatives to be professionally and appropriately dressed. FWM employees and representatives shall wear shirts at all times, including set-up and take-down. All FWM employee and representative tattoos and/or body piercings that Arnold deems offensive, objectionable or inappropriate shall be covered while performance contractual activities. FWM shall immediately suspend activities when an employee or representative is in violation of the provisions of this paragraph until such time that the employee or representative comes into compliance or is replaced by another employee or representative that is in compliance with the provisions of this paragraph.
- c. <u>Alcohol, Tobacco & Drug Use</u>. FWM shall ensure that its employees comply with the Arnold's tobacco, alcohol or illegal drugs ordinances and/or policies.
- d. <u>Site Restoration.</u> Upon conclusion of the Arnold Days celebration, FWM shall restore the area occupied by the tents to its prior condition. Such restoration shall include asphalt repairs to the satisfaction of the Arnold's designated representative.

- e. Federal, State & Local Laws. FWM shall operate in accordance with all relevant Federal, State and local laws, including, but not limited, to all workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance requirements. In the event that FWM subcontracts any work for Arnold Days, FWM shall require the subcontractor(s) to provide similar workers' compensation insurance as required by the laws of the State of Missouri. Violation by FWM of any law, ordinance or regulation shall be grounds for Arnold to terminate the contract and Arnold shall incur no liability to FWM should it do so.
- 7. Indemnity. FWM shall indemnify Arnold, its elected officials, officers, employees and volunteers and hold it harmless from and against each and every claim which may be made against Arnold, its elected officials, officers, employees and volunteers for death, personal injury, or property damage which is in any way connected to FWM's operations under this Agreement. FWM's obligation under this Agreement shall include the obligation to defend any and all such claims which may be made against Arnold and to pay all costs, including attorney's fees, which are paid by Arnold.
- 8. Insurance. FWM shall, at FWM's sole expense, maintain a policy of comprehensive commercial liability insurance insuring Arnold's interests against claims for personal injury, bodily injury, death, and property damage arising out of FWM's operation during Arnold Days and required duties under this Agreement, covering personal injury liability, bodily injury liability and property damage liability of not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence and Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) in the aggregate. Such insurance shall provide coverage for premises operations, acts of independent contractors, and completed operations during the Arnold Days Celebration. The operation of Arnold Days includes the dates of set up, scheduled operation, take down and clean-up. Arnold must be endorsed as an additional insured on such policy. FWM shall provide Arnold a current Certificates of Insurance evidencing FWM's compliance with this Paragraph by August 25th of each year of this Agreement. Violation of this paragraph shall be grounds for Arnold to delay the execution or terminate the agreement, and Arnold shall incur no liability to FWM should it do so.

9. Miscellaneous.

Attorney's Fees: If any party is required to retain legal counsel in order to enforce this Agreement, with or without the commencement of a formal legal action, such party shall be entitled to recover its attorney's fees and costs from the breaching party or parties. In addition, Arnold shall be entitled to attorney's fees and costs for all expenses arising out of a default by the FWM.

Binding Effect: This Agreement shall be binding on the parties and their respective heirs' successors and assigns.

Governing Law: This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri.

Modifications: This Agreement shall not be amended or modified except by written document signed by the party to be charged with such amendment or modification.

Notices: Any notice, demand, request, consent, approval or other communication (collectively, the "Notices") required or permitted to be given by any provision of this Agreement shall be in writing and sent by hand-delivery, by special courier (for example Federal Express), by United States Certified Mail (return receipt requested, postage prepaid), or by telefax, addressed to the party to be so notified. Notice pursuant to this Agreement shall be deemed delivered as follows: if hand delivered, at the time of delivery; if sent by special courier, on the third (3rd) day after deliver to the courier; if mailed, on the later of the date of receipt or the third day after deposit thereof in the United States Mails; and if sent by telefax, on the date that the telefax is acknowledged as received.

Assignment: FWM may not assign this Agreement without the written consent of Arnold.

<u>No Waiver</u>: No failure to exercise, delay in exercising or single or partial exercise of any right, power or remedy by any party hereto shall constitute a waiver thereof or shall preclude any other or further exercise of the same or any other right, power or remedy.





Request

The City has received an application from Riley-Spence & Associates, Inc. for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for The Woodlands Retirement Community. The retirement development is zoned R6 Residential and the Conditional Use Permit (2018-01) will be used to authorize a new assisted living facility on lot 3b.

Summary of Planning Commission Meeting

The request for a Conditional Use Permit was heard at the January 23 Planning Commission meeting, which included a public hearing. The applicant was in attendance at both the public hearing and regular meeting. The applicant spoke briefly to give and an overview of the assisted living facility. The Planning Commission unanimously voted to forward the Conditional Use Permit to City Council with a recommendation of approval with the following findings and conditions:

Findings:

- 1) The purposed use and expansion is within the scope of the Conditional Use Permit (84-15) passed in 1984.
- 2) This Condition Use Permit (2018-01) will authorize the expansion of community and allow all existing units and beds to remain in the community.

Conditions:

- 1) Trees shall be planted as a buffer between the single family residences of Anthony Court Subdivision and the storm water detention area.
- 2) The retaining wall must be tiered or removed from setback.
- 3) Retaining walls must be decorative and not plain concrete block.
- 4) Provide architectural elevations indicating material and color.
- 5) Provide a landscape plan for review and approval. Please refer to our commercial district requirements for expectations on plantings.

- 6) Provide lighting plan indicating pole heights (20 foot max including base) fixtures, cut sheets, etc.
- 7) Provide a parking formula/demand estimate demonstrating that parking can be handled by the site. Street parking will not be allowed.

Analysis

The Woodlands Retirement Community is zoned R6 Residential and the existing uses on the site are authorized via Conditional Use Permit (CUP 84-15). The initial conditional use permit was issued in 1984 and subsequently amended in 1988, 1997, 2001, 2002, and 2005 to accommodate growth and changes to the community. That permit with all the amendments will be repealed and replaced by this Conditional Use Permit. The new CUP will consolidate all the conditions of the original CUP and amendments. If there is an existing ordinance that covers an original condition then it will not be added to the new CUP.

The most recent iteration of the CUP authorized the following beds and units:

- 188 Nursing Beds
- 70 Apartment Units
- 76 Condo Units

The new Conditional Use Permit application will authorize:

- 260 Nursing Beds
- 38 Apartment Units
- 38 Condos Units

The current CUP authorization will reduce the number of apartment and condo units allowed on the site. There will at the same time be an increase in the number of nursing beds to allow for the development of a new forty-eight (48) bed assisted living center at 555 Woodlands Villas.

The use is deemed consistent with good planning practice. Retirement communities are an appropriate residential district use.

The use can be operated in a manner that is not detrimental to the permitted developments and uses in the district. The site has been used as a retirement community for decades and this will be an expansion on the existing development.


The use can be develop and operated in a manner that is visually compatible with the permitted uses in the surrounding area. This use is consistent with the church adjacent to the community. The condition to maintain the landscape buffer along rear of homes on Anthony Ct will remain in place to lessen the impact to the single family homes in the area.



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
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
