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BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Ms. Ruth Houser, 3148 Arnold Tenbrook, which is on the corner of Telegraph and Arnold Tenbrook, requested the city look into lighted signage for the dark intersection near her home so as to help the big trucks coming that way. Mayor Pro-tem directed Public Works Director Jeff Blue to investigate and consider options to make this happen.

Phil Amato added a solar lighting company is expected to provide demo equipment in about 30 days for other projects here in the city and this might also work and be a good solution for that corner.

Jim Edwards, 3338 Boca Raton, addressed the council regarding the closing of the Ozark Bridge a few years ago and feels a decision needs to made on this bridge replacement project.

Greg Hall added he had provided a memo regarding the bridge replacement and where the city is with this today. He gave background and talked about Mr. Rosenfeld's objection to his share of the cost. Mr. Hall feels condemnation may be in the picture if the city wants this issue resolved.

Matt Hay, 1135 Airglades, read a prepared statement voicing his feelings about the city denying access in regards to folks coming into our facilities to photograph animals.

Susan Rhoades, 1467 Wayne, also spoke out against the city's resistance to allow photographing of the animals at the city animal facility. She would like the city to consider a volunteer program to allow others to work with the animals in the shelter.

Janet Banks, 9667 Yorkshire Estates, identified herself as a 5 year volunteer in the city of St. Louis. She stated waivers had to be signed and liability issues addressed there and feels the city of Arnold could do likewise.

Normal Moss, 2270 Fawn, stated a shooting had just occurred inside the Kirkwood City Hall tonight and expressed concern for the safety and protection of those in our council chambers. Suggested city take steps to secure and make our chambers safer.

Faith Welker, 2116 Doe Run, admitted she was the person photographing the animals in the city shelter and felt it helped get them adopted.

Elizabeth Johnston, 3099 Kerry Road in Festus, added these photos are very important in dog fostering and adoption.

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Al Ems stated enough has been said about dogs and reiterated the policy is in-house and done administratively but will be looked into.

Much discussion regarding the **Hale Motors Expansion Conditional Use Permit**. *For the record* Phil Amato stated he has nothing personal against this man. However, he will stay consistent with his past voting record and not support used car lots. He feels this is poor planning on the part of the city, there are safety concerns, and he is upset with Koch Development over this.
