Mayor Ron Counts called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Those in attendance as noted by City Clerk Tammi Casey; Mayor Counts, Fleischmann, Plunk, McArthur, Sullivan, Cooley, Owens, Amato, Fulbright, Richison, Casey, Holden, Sweeney, Boone, Blattner, Kroupa and Chief Shockey.

#### MELODY LANE STORM WATER

Ed Blattner spoke to the council regarding the best option for correcting the storm water issue on Melody Lane. The studies have identified seven homes that would need to be purchased and removed. If this is done the City could alleviate a lot of the issues and move forward with the project, which is estimated at \$2.5 million to complete. Tempo, Rhythm, Melody and Harmony will receive new storm water pipes. The project will also include some basic street repairs. Keywest will not be touched, as that would cause problems further downstream. Discussion followed by council.

Mayor Counts polled the council to see if there was interest in moving forward with the project. The council indicated they wished to move forward.

#### **ANNEXATION**

Phil Amato had indicated he would like to see the three Fox C6 schools that are outside city limits annexed into the City. He would like to see this item placed on the November ballot, which means a decision would have to be made by the August filing deadline. Bob Sweeney informed council of what would need to take place before this is placed on a ballot and stated that until we determine exactly what specific areas the City wants to annex we can't really move forward. The City would not only have to identify every person in the areas we wish to annex, we would have to send them notifications, have a Public Hearing and inform those people of what services the City is willing to provide them before we could proceed, these are only a few of the tasks that would need to be done. Also, a declaratory judgment must be made in Circuit Court before we could proceed and the court system does not move that quickly. There is simply not enough time to complete all the tasks that would have to be completed before the August filing deadline.

Discussion followed by council. The general consensus was that while annexing is a great idea, it is not something that should be rushed into. Mayor Counts stated that he feels the best way to move forward with this idea is to form a committee to get things started. He asked council to contact him if they are interested in serving on the committee.

Vernon Sullivan made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Gary Plunk.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND ENACTING A NEW CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, COUNTY OF JEFFERSON, STATE OF MISSOURI; ESTABLISHING THE SAME; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES NOT INCLUDED THEREIN, EXCEPT AS HEREIN EXPRESSLY PROVIDED; PROVIDING FOR THE MANNER OF AMENDING SUCH CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Arnold, County of Jefferson, State of Missouri, as follows"

#### Section 1. Approval, Adoption and Enactment of Code

Pursuant to Section 71.943 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, the codification of ordinances, as set out in Titles I through VII, each inclusive, of the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Arnold, County of Jefferson, State of Missouri", is hereby adopted and enacted as the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Arnold"; which shall supersede all other general and permanent ordinances of the City passed on or before January 21, 2016, to the extent provided in Section 3 hereof.

#### Section 2. When Code Provisions Become Effective

All provisions of such Code shall be in full force and effect from and after the effective date of this ordinance as set forth herein.

# Section 3. Repeal of Legislation Not Contained in Code; Legislation Saved From Repeal; Matters Not Affected By Repeal.

- A. All ordinances of a general and permanent nature of the City adopted on final passage on or before January 21, 2016, and not included in such Code or recognized and continued in force by reference therein, are hereby repealed from and after the effective date of this ordinance, except those which may be specifically excepted by separate ordinance, and except the following which are hereby continued in full force and effect, unless specifically repealed by separate ordinance:
  - 1. Any offense or act committed or done or any penalty or forfeiture incurred or any contract or right established or accruing before the effective date of this ordinance.
  - 2. Ordinances promising or guaranteeing the payment of money for the City, or authorizing the issuance of any bonds or notes of the City or any other evidence of the City's indebtedness, or authorizing any contract or obligation assumed by the City.
  - 3. Ordinances levying taxes or making special assessments.
  - 4. Ordinances appropriating funds or establishing salaries and compensation, and providing for expenses, not inconsistent with this Code.
  - 5. Ordinances granting franchises or rights to any person, firm or corporation.
  - 6. Ordinances relating to the dedication, establishing, locating, relocating, opening, closing, naming, establishment of grades, improvement, altering, paving, widening, vacating, or in any way affecting any streets, alleys, sidewalks, or public places or ways in the City.
  - 7. Ordinances authorizing or relating to particular public improvements.

- 8. Ordinances respecting the conveyances or acceptance of real property or easements in real property.
- 9. Ordinances dedicating, accepting or vacating any plat or subdivision in the City or any part thereof, or providing regulations for the same.
- 10. Ordinances annexing property to the City.
- 11. All zoning and subdivision ordinances not specifically repealed.
- 12. Ordinances establishing TIF districts or redevelopment districts.
- 13. Any ordinance establishing traffic regulations for specific streets or portions thereof.
- 14. All ordinances relating to personnel regulations (e.g., pensions, retirement, job descriptions and insurance, etc.)
- 15. Ordinances authorizing the establishment of industrial development corporations.
- 16. Ordinances establishing tax rates for the City.
- 17. The administrative ordinances of the City, not in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this Code.
- 18. Any ordinance providing for local improvements or assessing taxes therefor.
- 19. Any ordinance establishing or altering Council ward boundaries.
- B. The repeal provided for in this Section shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or part thereof that has been repealed by a subsequent ordinance which is repealed by this ordinance.
- C. The repeal provided for in this Section shall not affect any offense or act committed or done or any penalty or forfeiture incurred or any contract or right established or accruing before the effective date of this ordinance, nor shall it affect any prosecution, suit or proceeding pending or any judgment rendered prior to such date.

#### Section 4. Amendments To Code

Any and all additions and amendments to such Code when passed in such form as to indicate the intention of the City Council to make the same a part thereof shall be deemed to be incorporated in such Code so that reference to the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Arnold" shall be understood and intended to include such additions and amendments.

#### Section 5. Violations and Penalties

A. Except as hereinafter provided, whenever in any rule, regulation or order promulgated pursuant to such ordinances of the City, any act is prohibited or is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, or whenever in such City ordinance, rule, regulation or order doing of any act is required or the failure to do any act is declared to be unlawful, where no specific penalty is provided therefor, the violation of any such ordinance of the City, or of any rule, regulation or order promulgated pursuant to such City ordinance, shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

- B. Whenever any provision of the Revised Statutes of Missouri or other Statute of the State limits the authority of the City to punish the violation of any particular provision of these ordinances or rules, regulations or orders promulgated pursuant thereto to a fine of less amount than that provided in this Section or imprisonment for a shorter term than that provided in this Section, the violation of such particular provision of these ordinances or rules, regulations or orders shall be punished by the imposition of not more than the maximum fine or imprisonment so authorized, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- C. Whenever any provision of the Revised Statutes of Missouri or other Statute of the State establishes a penalty differing from that provided by this Section for an offense similar to any offense established by these ordinances, rules, regulations or other orders of the City, the violation of such City law, ordinance, rule, regulation or order shall be punished by the fine or imprisonment established for such similar offense by such State law.
- D. Each day any violation of these ordinances, rules, regulations or orders promulgated pursuant thereto shall continue shall constitute a separate offense, unless otherwise provided.
- E. Whenever any act is prohibited by this Code, by an amendment thereof, or by any rule or regulation adopted thereunder, such prohibition shall extend to and include the causing, securing, aiding or abetting of another person to do said act. Whenever any act is prohibited by this Code, an attempt to do the act is likewise prohibited.

#### Section 6. Applicability of General Penalty

In case of the amendment by the City Council of any Section of such Code for which a penalty is not provided, the general penalty as provided in Section 5 of this ordinance shall apply to the Section as amended; or in case such amendment contains provisions for which a penalty other than the aforementioned general penalty is provided in another Section in the same Chapter, the penalty so provided in such other Section shall be held to relate to the Section so amended, unless such penalty is specifically repealed therein.

#### Section 7. Filing of Copy of Code; Codes To Be Kept Up-To-Date

A copy of such Code shall be kept on file in the office of the City Clerk, preserved in loose-leaf form or in such other form as the City Clerk may consider most expedient. It shall be the express duty of the City Clerk, or someone authorized by said officer, to insert in their designated places all amendments and all ordinances or resolutions which indicate the intention of the City Council to make the same part of such Code when the same have been printed or reprinted in page form and to extract from such Code all provisions which from time to time may be repealed by the City Council. This copy of such Code shall be available for all persons desiring to examine the same.

#### Section 8. Altering or Tampering With Code; Violations and Penalties

It shall be unlawful for any person to change or alter by additions or deletions any part or portion of such Code, or to insert or delete pages or portions thereof, or to alter or tamper with such Code in any manner whatsoever which will cause the law of the City of Arnold to be misrepresented thereby. Any person violating this Section shall be punished as provided in Section 5 of this ordinance.

#### Section 9. Severability

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the Sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance and the Code hereby adopted are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or Section of this ordinance or the Code hereby adopted shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and Sections of this ordinance or the Code hereby adopted.

# AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A RECORD PLAT TITLED "FOXWOOD ESTATES"



## AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A NEW PRELIMINARY PLAT TITLED FOXWOOD ESTATES

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Arnold has reviewed a proposed preliminary plat and has submitted a report with findings and conditions of said preliminary plat titled "Foxwood Estates" to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the proper public hearings have been held, pursuant to City Ordinance and the laws of the State of Missouri, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Arnold is required to review the preliminary plat and consider its approval;

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City of Arnold hereby accepts and approves the preliminary plat titled "Foxwood Estates." Said development is located on a 14.98-acre tract of land located just off Tenbrook Road.

<u>Section 2</u>. The acceptance and approval of the preliminary plat for "Foxwood Estates" as presented to this City Council in no way relieves the developer of the responsibility of meeting the requirements of any other public or private entity having jurisdiction over such developments, or the requirements of the ordinances of the City of Arnold, Missouri.

<u>Section 3</u>. The acceptance and approval of "Foxwood Estates" as presented to this City Council is in no way an endorsement of said construction, development or layout, or an acceptance of any publicly dedicated improvements until said improvements have been properly inspected by the Community Development Department and accepted by the City Council as provided by ordinance.

<u>Section 4</u>. The preliminary plat identified as "Foxwood Estates" shall be valid for a period of two (2) years from the date of its approval.

<u>Section 5</u>. The preliminary plat identified as "Foxwood Estates" is subject to the findings and conditions outlined in the Staff report to the City Council dated September 14, 2015 and as follows:

#### Findings for Subdivision Variance:

- 1. The granting of the variance will not be detrimental to the public safety, health, or welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located.
- 2. Because of the particular physical surroundings, shape or topographical conditions of the specific property involved, a particular hardship to the owner would result, as distinguished from a mere inconvenience, if the strict letter of these regulations are carried out.
- 3. The variance will not in any manner vary the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance, Comprehensive Plan, or Subdivision Code.

#### Conditions

- 1. Submit storm water quality and detention for review and approval.
- 2. Receive approval from the Board of Adjustment for the seven foot side yard setback.
- 3. The trees indicated on the lots be identified if they meet the size requirements and ensure they do not exceed the required amount needed to be saved.

- 4. \$60,000 is deposited with the City for a sidewalk contribution instead of building a sidewalk along this stretch of Tenbrook Road due to steep grades and the amount of disturbance needed to construct a sidewalk.
- 5. The 3.79 acres indicated as common ground is placed in a permanent open space easement to preserve the hillside and trees on the hillside while providing for maintenance of the water quality/detention areas.
- 6. The variance to the lot frontage requirements of lots 2-10, 14-21, 24-30, and 34-37 are approved based on the findings listed above.
- 7. The developer project engineer provides an evaluation of the storm volume that the Tenbrook Rd roadside ditch could accommodate. This should be based on the current project survey and USGS topo. The roadside ditch along Tenbrook should be improved within the City Right of way along the frontage of the project (from the intersection of the subdivision to the far south corner of the common ground) also the Tenbrook street culvert crossing resized, replaced or improved or as needed. Additionally, the detention basin discharge between the homes near 2929 Tenbrook should be reviewed for acceptability and improved only if absolutely needed, as required for channel protection.
- 8. If during the review of the improvement plans or in the field during inspections it becomes obvious repairs, adjustment, modification of existing streets, sight distance, storm water/other infrastructure is identified such deficiencies shall be corrected.
- 9. The driveway at 2922 Tenbrook Rd. is repaired or replaced due to damage from the construction of the improvements at this location.


#### Section 6. General Development Conditions apply as follows:

- a. A grading permit is required prior to any grading on the site.
- b. If cut and fill operations occur during a season not favorable for immediate establishment of a permanent ground cover, a fast germinating annual, such as rye, shall be utilized to retard erosion.
- C. The petitioner shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary permits and approvals from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, Public Water Supply District No. 1, American Water and Rock Community Fire Protection District as they relate to the development of this tract of land.
- d. Provide adequate temporary off-street parking for construction employees. Parking on non-surfaced areas is prohibited in order to eliminate the conditions whereby mud from construction and employee vehicles is tracked onto the pavement causing hazardous roadway and driving conditions.
- e. Failure to comply with any or all the conditions of this ordinance shall be adequate cause for revocation of permits by issuing City Departments or Commissions.

Section 7. The approval of the City Council under the hand and seal of the city shall be endorsed upon said plat.

<u>Section 8</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and City Council.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES WITH THE ADDITION OF ARTICLE XVII, ESTABLISHING THE ARNOLD COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

WHEREAS, a community fund assists in ensuring public support for enriching the quality of life in the community; and

WHEREAS, the enrichment of the quality of life helps ensure that public welfare and;

WHEREAS, the City of Arnold is in the unique position to organize and support a community fund.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended with the addition of a new Article XVII, to read as follows:

"ARTICLE XVII. - ARNOLD COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

Sec. 2-491. - Created; purpose.

The Arnold Community Foundation is established as an agency of the city to promote the general welfare by enriching the quality of life for the residents of the city and the surrounding community by promoting arts, culture, civic life, seniors, children/youth, health/well-being and education.

Sec. 2-492. - Composition; appointment.

The Arnold Community Foundation Board of Directors shall consist of seven (7) voting members. The mayor, subject to the approval of the city council, shall appoint six (6) members. Applicants must:

- (1) Reside within the corporate limits of the city; or
- (2) Own a business within the corporate limits of the city.

The mayor (or his/her designee) shall serve as one of the voting members of the board of directors.

The mayor or city council may assign staff to assist in the goals of the Foundation as deemed appropriate.

Sec. 2-493. - Compensation.

Members of the Foundation shall serve without compensation.

Sec. 2-494. - Terms; filling vacancies.

Members of the board of directors will be appointed for a term of three (3) years; but, of the members first appointed, one (1) shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, two (2) shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years, and three (3) shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years. The mayor, or his/her designee, shall serve during the term of the mayor.

Sec. 2-495. - Removal of members.

The mayor, with a majority of the city council or a three-fourths (3/4) majority of the city council may remove any director of the Foundation, with or without cause.

Sec. 2-496. - Election of chair and secretary.

The board of directors shall elect its chair and secretary from among the members. The term of chair and secretary shall be for one (1) year with eligibility for reelection.

Sec. 2-497. - Meetings, rules, record.

The board of directors shall meet within sixty (60) days of the appointment of its members and shall adopt rules for the transaction of business. Among its rules shall be a requirement to keep a public record of its proceedings, which shall be periodically provided in a written report to the city council. All rules adopted by the board of directors shall be submitted to the city council for final approval. In addition to the regularly scheduled meetings, such other meetings shall be held as may be directed by the mayor or the council.

Sec. 2-498. – Appropriations; Expenditures.

The Foundation shall be an agency of the city, but all funds of the Foundation raised by, allocated to, or otherwise obtained by the Foundation shall be used exclusively to carry out the purposes of the Foundation and may not be otherwise directed, used or appropriated by the city or any agency of the city.

The Foundation shall administer and expend moneys within the limits of its purpose.

Sec. 2-499. - Acceptance of gifts/grants.

The Foundation may solicit and accept grants or gifts from any source not prohibited by law. Sec. 2-500. - Plans—Contents; implementation.

The Foundation shall prepare and review data, conduct analyses, and review other pertinent information and take all steps necessary to ensure it successful completion of its purpose

Sec. 2-501. - Additional powers and duties.

The Foundation shall have such other powers and duties as are or may be prescribed by the laws of the State of Missouri or the ordinances of the City of Arnold, Missouri.

Secs. 2-502—2-511. - Reserved."
