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Bob Sweeney – Stated the grass cutting issue is rather an emergent situation and they will be moving forward quickly to resolve the issue.

Dave Crutchley – Informed everyone the Strawberry Festival will be this Saturday at the Farmers Market and the outdoor pool will open May 28th. The shred event went very well and they accommodated approximately 400 cars. The next event at the outdoor pool will be the electronics recycling event on June 4th.

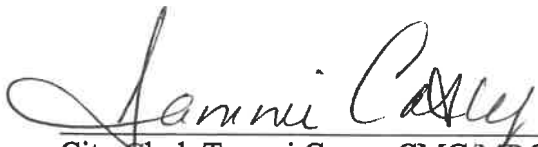
Mayor Counts announced a five-minute recess before going into Closed Session.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 600 (ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES) OF THE ARNOLD CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADDING A DEFINITION THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 600.020, Definitions, of the Arnold Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding the following:

“AMUSEMENT PLACE/ENTERTAINMENT PLACE

A place of public accommodation that offers indoor services or facilities, or outdoor services or facilities involving close contact of persons, for amusement or other recreational or entertainment purposes. A place of public amusement/entertainment includes, but is not limited to, an amusement park, arcade, bingo hall, bowling alley, indoor climbing facility, skating rink, trampoline park, and other similar recreational or entertainment facilities.”

SECTION 2. If any part of this Ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or any part thereof and said Ordinance shall be read as if said invalid provision was struck therefrom and the context thereof changed accordingly with the remainder of the Ordinance to be and remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 115.625 (VETERANS COMMISSION COMPOSITION) OF THE ARNOLD CODE OF ORDINANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 115.625, Composition-Appointment, of the Arnold Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

The Commission shall consist of seven (7) voting members (three (3) veterans and four (4) at-large members), one alternate and one Council liaison.

SECTION 2. If any part of this Ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or any part thereof and said Ordinance shall be read as if said invalid provision was struck therefrom and the context thereof changed accordingly with the remainder of the Ordinance to be and remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
