RESOLUTION NO. 15-27 – A RESOLUTION RE-APPOINTING BILL KNITTIG, RICHARD KRAUS AND JAMES HENSON TO THE AGING AND DISABILITIES COMMISSION FOR A THREE-YEAR TERM

MOTIONS

A. 2015-11 CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR A MODIFICATION TO EXISTING COMMERCIAL CENTER SIGN AT 100 RICHARDSON CROSSING

Mary Holden informed council that this permit application was to modify the existing sign at Richardson Crossing to add 60 square feet of sign panels to the bottom of the sign. The Planning Commission held a public hearing at their May 26, 2015 meeting. The only one to speak at the Public Hearing was the applicant. The Planning Commission is forwarding a recommendation of approval by a vote of 8-0. If no action is taken, the conditional use permit stands approved. **No action was taken**.

B. 2015-12 CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR A COMMERCIAL CENTER SIGN AT 1298 JEFFCO BLVD. (RIDGECREST AND JEFFCO)

Mary Holden informed council that this is a request to construct a commercial center sign for Ridgecrest Crossing. The Planning Commission held a public hearing at their May 26, 2015 meeting. A resident who lives adjacent to Ridgecrest Crossing spoke at the public hearing addressing light trespass concerns. This concern was addressed during the regular meeting explaining that the sign would be blocked by the building. After discussion, the Planning Commission is forwarding a recommendation of approval by a vote of 8-0.

Discussion followed by council. The council was informed that this request is in compliance with the City's sign code. Phil Amato stated that he is opposed to this conditional use permit application. If no action is taken, the conditional use permit stands approved. **No action was taken**.

Ward 4 – Butch Cooley – Thanked the Veterans Commission and volunteers for placing the flags around the City for Memorial Day.

Ward 3 – Phil Amato – Stating the response he heard regarding the flags was great and the Veterans Commission would eventually like to place around 300 flags lining Jeffco Blvd. Their fundraising efforts continue. Mr. Amato invited Mike Evans to the microphone who informed the council that the volunteers from Boeing were a tremendous help placing the flags and that the donations received from organizations such as the Tourism Committee, Anheuser Busch and the VFW Ladies Auxiliary were what made this all possible. Mr. Evans also informed the council that the Commission, along with an elected official has been invited to attend a meeting regarding veteran's issues in downtown St. Louis.

Bob Sweeney – Stated that the sewer sale is complete and the transition is progressing nicely.

Susie Boone – Stated that there will be a two person scramble golf tournament next Saturday. Pomme Creek Golf Course will hold their first ever family night on June 19th.
