RESOLUTION NO. 13-04 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A TWO-YEAR CONTRACT WITH THE JEFFERSON COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP (JCCP) FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF THE JEFFCO EXPRESS BUS ROUTE was discussed.

Sandra Kownacki asked if this could be tabled as she had questions.

Chief indicated this should be handled tonight, advising the contract is up and city extended it for an extra week just to get to this point in time.

Paul Freese offered a motion to approve Resolution No. 13-04, with the 10 hour day and including the vehicle. Bill Moritz seconded the motion.

There was confusion as Doris Borgelt felt there was already a motion made by Ms. Kownacki. Ms. Kownacki had understood her statement was to be a motion.

Both Mr. Freese and Mr. Moritz withdrew their motions respectively.

Ms. Kownacki clarified and offered a motion to table Resolution No. 13-04.
Seconded by Doris Borgelt.

More discussion. In an effort to move things along and reply to Ms. Kownacki's concerns, Dennis Murphy, Project coordinator from Jeffco Express was asked to speak. He explained how the city does pay money to JCCP and JCCP sub-contracts to Oates. JCCP does not make any money and everyone involved tries to get grant funding etc.

Ken Moss asked when the contract expired and chief advised a week ago. Ken Moss suggested waiting until the next council meeting and make the decision then. He also questioned what this extra week has cost the city.

Finance Director indicated it is about \$2400 month, so that would be about \$600 a week, indicating this was within our purchasing codes.

Attorney advised the motion must first pass to table and then another motion could be made to extend contract a month.

Sandra Kownacki acknowledged her questions were answered but when given the opportunity to withdraw motion; she chose not to and requested voting.

Bill Moritz expressed concern about the loss of grant money and funds if service is disrupted and called the question.

Roll call vote to table Resolution No. 13-04. Freese, no; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Hohmeier, no; Moritz, no; Amato, no; 4 nays, 3 yeas, **motion failed.**

Resolution. No. 13-04. Chief advised council would need to determine which options on the contract to accept before voting to actually accept the contract. For **reimbursement, Option B (10 hour service) and Capital costs, Option A** were selected. Paul Freese offered a motion and so moved. Seconded by Phil Amato. Roll call vote: Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, no; Hohmeier, no; Moritz, yes; Amato, yes; 5 yeas, 2 nays. **Resolution passed.**

Councilman Phil Amato left the council chambers at 7:23 p.m.

Mayor advised Christie Hull- Bettale to look into this.

Mrs. Hohmeier also asked about the water and ice on Richardson Road. Mrs. Hull-Bettale responded city is aware and is trying to resolve this problem and at this time, city is treating with salt to prevent ice buildup. She also thanked attorney for responding to questions she had asked regarding the CID and the offer to Garrison.

Attorney Sweeney – Thanked Mr. Moritz

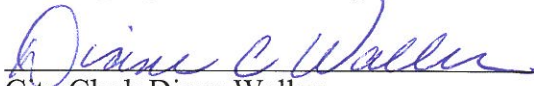

I have served three terms as a councilman from ward 2. I first ran in 2006 and came within 6 voters of victory. I ran again in 2007 against a councilman who had the second longest tenure in the job. I won that year and went to work. I ran on a campaign to improve safety on the streets in part because of what I had seen on my own street and to prevent the abuse of eminent domain. Once I was elected and got involved it did not take long to figure out what was going on and to start working with the rest of the council to get things done. The issues with eminent domain, while distasteful to me, have done nothing less than transform this city. With the exception of renewing agreements that were already in place, that issue was over with when I got here. The Arnold Commons and Arnold Crossroads were developed. An existing billboard, one of my pet peeves, was put back in on the THF property. It was their billboard after they bought it from Mark and we would have been in breach of contract had we not let it go back in on the same property. I was the driving force in preventing further billboards from being introduced in this city and was responsible for killing two that were going through the approvals. I list that as an accomplishment.

When I joined the council, the matter of the Ozark Bridge and the entirely unpopular detour onto Rosedale Drive was in its third year. I dug into the problem and made a commitment to get the project completed. Much political hay was made of the problem and a few lawsuits were filed. In the end, a fine bridge was erected and the detour was closed. As a side note, in further negotiations, we were able to approve the purchase of a piece of land adjacent to the bridge that increased the size of Ferd Lang Park by 60%. The city's relationship with the contentious businessman, in negotiations with Chief Shockey, was greatly improved. This resolved the matter of unsightly mobile homes in the flood way along Pomme Creek and added yet more land to the park. This showed that even though we hold differences, we can come to an agreement and work things out. Good job Bob Shockey and good job by the council for approving it. In the next several years, there will be a soccer park or something equally useful on this new land. I am very pleased to have been a part of the solution.

I was happy to support and pass the new Arnold Comprehensive Plan. It is intended as a blueprint for the next twenty years of evolution of our city. It represents residents' desire for a control on zoning and an increase in public green-space. It is a wonderful guideline and I thank the Community Development Department and the Arnold Planning Commission on their work to bring this plan forward for adoption. When a challenge to that plan was forwarded with an unpopular idea of a semi-truck parking lot included on an otherwise acceptable site plan, I was more than happy to work with aggrieved residents from Wards 1 and 2 who asked me to get involved and to have it denied.

With all due respect to the two candidates for Ward 2 who suggest that we have not done enough to make it easier for businesses to come to Arnold, I offer the following. We worked with the Chamber of Commerce twice in my term to improve the sign ordinance. We still have work to do as the unsightly truck trailer in the Commons apparently being used as additional storage conveniently is allowed to display a vinyl appliqué sign displaying the never ending bedding sale. We also put in place a fast track permitting process that may be employed. The test case was when the Intagliata brothers put in place their 100,000 square feet manufacturing business. The goal was to get all the approvals done in 30 days. It was done in 18. SGI is now looking to move their entire manufacturing business to Arnold. This plan was an idea of Ward 3 Councilman Phil Amato's and he deserves the credit for a job well done. A

little over three years ago Ken Moss, Christine Lang, Jim Edwards, Paul Freese, Phil Amato and I sat in my front yard before the election and worked out an agreement to signal our intent that eminent domain would not be used again in Arnold for economic development. It is not binding upon some future council who may revoke the ordinance but it conveyed our clear intent that it not be used that way again. Thanks to two former city administrators who helped with the language of the ordinance. While I was the chair of the Liquor committee we rewrote the entire liquor control ordinance greatly simplifying the process for restaurants and retail vendors to do business with the city. We have kept the lowest city business license fees in the area. We got a lot done with respect to making it easier and more welcoming for businesses to set up in Arnold. Don't fall for the rhetoric.

Phil Amato says that the social calendar of a city councilman is filled with city events and social interactions with subdivision meetings and resolving the issues that concern our residents. I was happy to do this. It is one of the methods in reaching out to residents and addressing their concerns and problems. One of my first projects completed was with Storm Water Superintendent Tom Passiq, his team and former Public Works Director Jeff Blue. I heard from Mary Blum on Sunset Drive whose home was being flooded with every heavy rain. I took up her problem and by working with Public we got her and her neighbors a permanent fix diverting the water away from her yard and into the creek. I was so pleased to see how happy she was that this years-long problem was ended in short order.

One of my proudest accomplishments was to support and pass the expansion of the AB-InBev Metal Container Corporation can plant on Arnold Tenbrook Road. The original proposal was for an investment of approximately \$60 million dollars and included Arnold's condition that all 125 current employees would be retained. AB-InBev countered by raising the scope of the project to \$80 million dollars and a guarantee to hire an additional 25 and up to 60 new employees at the high union wages. Skilled union tradesmen are being employed right now in the building of the expansion and I am very pleased with that. The project also resulted in a \$20 million expansion on Pestalozzi Street and could result in even more expansion in Arnold. This MCC plant which came within a single vote of failing last fall is destined to be the single largest producing metal container plant in the world for AB-InBev. We traded an upsize in the sanitary sewer line from the plant. I call that a more than fair trade. We have one council representative who claims this is not the role of government. If that was actually true, one of the mayoral candidates and four of the six city candidates for city council seats just do not agree as they all cited attracting and keeping business as a priority. They seem to think it is a role of local government and I agree. I am very happy to have contributed my support to that expansion project. This one project did more than any other, in my opinion, to show our commitment to expanding the manufacturing base and making Arnold a preferred small business destination. Superior Oil is locating their new facility nearby and Baskin Robins and Dunkin Donuts are moving in on the north side of town. I suggest that we have done a great deal to make Arnold much more business friendly. Now we pass the challenge to our successors to keep improving. You will not hit a homerun like the can plant and SGI manufacturing every year but for those who were paying attention in closed session, we have still another big project coming in. Welcome them and work with them.

I was very pleased the city council in 2006 took the time to hold multiple public hearings on the issue of the golf course acquisition. In the three public hearings, one of which was held at the golf course, not a

single resident spoke in opposition to the idea. All of the speakers, including me, were absolutely in favor of it. There was not a single person spoke in opposition to it. We now have this recreation jewel right here in town. I offer my thanks to C-6 Superintendent Dr. Dianne Brown, now Critchlow, for promising that Fox and Seckman golf teams will play and practice at Pomme Creek Golf Course. It was one of my pet projects to help out whenever I could and that included removing tree stumps and cleaning up Arnold offers a great venue as a municipal golf course and I have high admiration for Susie Boone and her team including Bob Furkin, Tim Schweirjohn and Kenny Gaal for their efforts improving the golf course.

Thanks to Tom Palasky, Bruce, Daniel, Keith, Mark, Mike, James and all the rest of the public works guys who worked on bringing in the new Public Works Offices to completion. I was very pleased to have worked with you all even if it was just to raise the dust while I swept up behind you. Sorry about that. That is a job well done guys. Thank you for the after-work hours and weekends you spent on the project.

I am very proud of Mayor Counts' participation in attracting state funding for the Arapaho Development project which resulted in the Watercolor Villas. That is a wonderful development. Imagine that – all the mayors who originally approached the state for funding and were unsuccessful did not come back the second time. Not willing to concede with a single win for Arnold, when it came time to ask in the next year's session those other mayors did not even show up. Here comes Ron Counts, who got the money last year by asking, asked again. I am very proud to acknowledge that he brought the bacon home and we will some have a similar development going in this year with the Richardson Villas. That, neighbors, fits within my definition of leadership. Well done sir.

I have a few things I would like to see completed when I leave and implore my successors on the council to follow up.

- 1) A Ward 2 Stormwater projects at Mr. Harrison's property on Cambridge Court. The dirt behind his house is being washed out and running down the storm drain near his house. It was the number three project on "the list" last year. I want it completed. He deserves no less. Ed, I am counting on you to look into these things.
- 2) Another Ward 2 Stormwater project is Mr. Heidorn's property on Sunset Drive. Stormwater from above his home is washing into his home. While he is high on the list, he is not high enough on that list. A temporary measure was put in place but it needs to be done properly and permanently.
- 3) Another Ward 2 Stormwater Mr. Colburg's property on Grant Drive needs attention. Since the city improved the storm water control on one side of the street, water now runs down into his yard and onto his porch. It is getting worse. Bryson Baker agreed with me that it needs to be done. Mr. Colburg has even contacted the mayor asking for help. Please get this addressed and run this water off into the forest.
- 4) In Ward 4, we need to follow through with the improvements proposed on Melody Lane. It is a shame that we have these lawsuits facing us over this harassment issue but the residents on Melody Lane may well be the ones who suffer because we could not get this resolved painlessly.

We approved the money for the design work to resolve this problem and we will need \$800,000 to fix the matter permanently. The voters will have to decide where we go with this but I implore the candidates for Ward 4 to not forget the residents on Melody who have been dealing with this horrible stormwater situation for years. It is past time to resolve it.

- 5) Pay Investigator Kevin Garrison for his work. Pay his attorney for her time in this matter and end it. Stop the foot dragging because some of us did not agree with the result of the investigation. He was properly contracted and he performed on that contract. He deserves to be paid.
- 6) Late last year it was presented to replace the sign in front of city hall. Please do it. The one we have looks old and shoddy. Also, please put up decent signs at the major entries. Announce to motorists that they are in our city.
- 7) Fund the Jeffco Express Bus Service as it fits directly into our Comprehensive Plan and is doing nothing less than improving the quality of life in the residents of Arnold who use the service.
- 8) For all council members I ask you to maintain our membership in the Missouri Municipal League and attend the conferences. You will learn a lot about how to do your job. I refer to the \$2 million Highway 141 - Astraway – Roundabout project completed in Ward 4 this year. I especially commend former Ward 1 Councilman Randy Crisler for paying attention in one MML breakout session. He saved the City of Arnold over \$300,000 with one idea he learned by attending that session on funding. That is a clear justification for continuing to send our council to these sessions. This year the annual MML conference is in Branson. Please go, have fun, and learn how to better your city. Read the monthly MML Review as there is a lot of information that will help you to understand the issues that affect how you will do this job. I got the idea of how another city dealt with nuisances from this publication and we put it in place in Arnold.
- 9) Find some other city held land parcel to mitigate the flood plain land purchased for extending Ferd Lang Park. There are two old watering ponds for horses that need to be filled. The Corps of Engineers will permit us to fill them and return the ground to its original state if we mitigate, or offset, an equal or greater parcel somewhere else. Work with Brian Waldrop and identify that land.
- 10) Last, we were challenged three years ago to get FEMA certification as disaster response team members. I am one of three councilmen who achieved the national certification. Imagine you were a city council member the day after the tornado struck Joplin and you did not know what to do. You do not have time to learn while people are calling for you to help them. You need to know how to help out immediately after an event and later to apply for and use federal emergency aid. I challenge the rest of you to attain the accreditation to be a disaster response team member. Please do not learn the basic need to know information through on the job training. Get certified. Chief Shockey can help you and if you want my help I will certainly help you. Do not learn what has to be done after an inevitable disaster has struck our city. I have two copies of the book about the Joplin disaster floating around the city hall. Read what Joplin did and become educated. Prepare for it and hope it never comes to pass.

My best wishes to those of you whose hearts are in the right place as you take on this job. I acknowledge proudly that Phil Amato has taught me a lot about how to do this job. My heart goes out and I offer my deepest admiration to three council representatives who have passed away during my

term here. I acknowledge Three Term Mayor Al Ems who came out of retirement to run for multiple terms on the city council. It was my honor to have spent a considerable amount of time with him at the Kansas City MML on the weekend of his 75th birthday. I recognize Jim Edwards who preceded me on the council seat for Ward 2. He and Jan and I became good friends and I was very proud to help him regain his seat in the next election. Most recently we lost Christine Lang. I hope we have not set some sort of record but I certainly hope for continued good health for everyone who remains and for those who will join the city council and staff.

To the members of the city staff I have not mentioned, thank you all for your service. First of all goodbye to Mary Ellen Cox. You are the sweetest valentine in the city hall.
