Mayor Ron Counts called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Pastor Jack Miller, of St. John's Lutheran Church, offered the opening prayer.

Those present per roll call taken by City Clerk Diane Waller: Counts, Moritz, Edwards, Amato, Freese, Kownacki, Moss, Borgelt, Lang, Unrein, Waller, Holden, Lewis, Sweeney, Boone, Shockey, Baker, Kroupa and Hall.

ACCEPTANCE OF THE MINUTES:

Bill Moritz moved to **accept the minutes of the May 5, 2011 meeting** if there were no deletions, errors or corrections. Jim Edwards seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Lang, yes; Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; 8 yeas, **Motion carried.**

ACCEPTANCE OF THE WARRANTS:

City Clerk Diane Waller read **Payroll warrant #1107**. Paul Freese moved to **pay payroll warrant #1107 in the amount of \$250,887.54** if the monies are available. Seconded by Ken Moss. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **Motion carried.**

City Clerk Diane Waller read **general warrant #5547**. Cricky Lang moved to **pay general warrant #5547 in the amount of \$ 574,246.73** if the monies are available. Seconded by Doris Borgelt. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **Motion carried.**

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

The Mayor explained how anyone could speak for up to 3 minutes on any matter of city business, but first must identify him or herself and state their address. He also reiterated the necessity of using the speaker cards.

Mayor recognized a Scout in the audience, Jonathan Hanks, of Troop 892, who is here working on his Citizenship in the Community badge.

Dan Govero, Jefferson County Growth and Development Association, distributed an informational brochure that is a vision of the future for Jefferson County. He indicated this was compiled based on input from county residents.

Jerel Poor, 756 Mary Lane, expressed concern about Resolution No. 11-17, asking questions, and reiterated to make sure it is about safety.

Matt Unrein asked that agenda be amended to bring forward at this point in the meeting the 2011-06 Conditional Use Permit SNJ Sno Cone Stand at 505-537 Jeffco Blvd. A **motion was made to amend** by Bill Moritz and he so moved. Seconded by Jim Edwards. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **motion carried**.

Mary Holden briefly spoke about the permit, adding Planning Commission recommends approval with conditions and this will stand approved unless council acts tonight. No action taken, so it stands approved.

ORDINANCES

Mr. Mark Spykerman, of Gilmore and Bell, spoke briefly regarding Bill No. 2466.

BILL NO. 2466 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TAXABLE TAX INCREMENT REVENUE NOTES (ARNOLD CROSSROADS REDEVELOPMENT AREA – DRURY REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT) SERIES A, OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO FINANCE CERTAIN REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT COSTS RELATING TO THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE ARNOLD CROSSROADS REDEVELOPMENT AREA – SUB-AREA 31,; AND APPROVING CERTAIN DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF THE NOTES was read twice by City Clerk Diane Waller. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **Ordinance passed**.

BILL NO. 2467 AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A RECORD PLAT TITLED “RESUBDIVISION OF LOT 11 OF WATER TOWER PLACE” was read twice by City Clerk Diane Waller. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **Ordinance passed**.

RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION NO. 11-15 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH CRAWFORD, BUNTE, AND BRAMMEIER TO PROVIDE CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE MISSOURI STATE ROUTE 141 AND ASTRA WAY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT was discussed. Bill Moritz offered a motion and he so moved. Seconded by Jim Edwards. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas **Resolution passed**.

RESOLUTION NO. 11-16 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH CRAWFORD, BUNTE, AND BRAMMEIER TO PROVIDE CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE MISSOURI STATE ROAD AND ASTRA WAY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT was discussed. Jim Edwards offered a motion and so moved. Seconded by Doris Borgelt. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **Resolution passed.**

RESOLUTION NO. 11-17 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT AMENDMENT WITH AMERICAN TRAFFIC SOLUTIONS was discussed.

Attorney explained ATS has agreed to provide a study to review the intersection at Jeffco and Tenbrook for a possible camera site and also the city agrees to use ATS collection services.

Questions were asked about the percentage ATS would collect if it goes to collection. Mr. Kroupa verified 30% of the recovered revenue in addition to ATS normal fees. The balance will be disbursed by the city to specific accounts as required. Much discussion ensued.

Phil Amato indicated he had two motions to offer and then provided background on the reason the city had gone with the red light cameras adding, since their use began in 2005 at the 3 intersections and 1 school, there have been no deaths and minimal t-bone accidents. This system has accomplished the safety the city desired. Mr. Amato offered **a motion and so moved to approach MoDot to allow city to put signage directly next to the traffic signal (on the same pole).** Seconded by Paul Freese.

Discussion followed.

Ms. Borgelt felt taking this action before the contract is voted on, is not proper. Attorney agreed and advised the appropriate procedure to do this. Both Mr. Amato and Mr. Freese then withdrew their motion.

Mr. Unrein advised ATS cannot do this, it would require city working with MoDot and it would be at city's expense.

More discussion on Resolution No. 11-17. Ms. Borgelt felt since MoDot had adjusted the lights, there have been less tickets issued. Mr. Moritz felt that city has made drivers much more aware of how the cameras work and this awareness has contributed to a decrease of tickets being issued. Ms. Lang also reiterated Arnold is not backing down on those that run the red lights and city is going after the violators. Mr. Moss acknowledged city has now gotten the message to our people and they are aware. Ms. Borgelt asked just what is the net to the city? Deborah Lewis explained how ticket revenue is disbursed to other entities, not just the city of Arnold. More discussion.

Treasurer Dan Kroupa left the chambers at 7:54 and returned at 7:57 as discussion continued.

Mayor expressed the cameras are an issue that some feel is a safety issue while others still feel it is a violation of constitutional rights and a money grabber. Mayor asked Ms. Lewis to look into what is really netted and if it can be earmarked.

Resolution No. 11-17 was read. Paul Freeze offered a **motion to approve** and so moved. Seconded by Ken Moss.

Doris Borgelt reported she had heard MoDot had approved the flashing light by 141 and Astra Way. Mr. Baker acknowledged and added he intends to include this in the plans when we go out for bid.

Roll call vote on Resolution No. 11-17: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freeze, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, no; Lang, yes; 7 yeas, 1 nay **Resolution passed.**

A motion to ask MoDot to allow the signage directly next to the light, on the traffic signal pole was then offered by Phil Amato and seconded by Paul Freeze. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freeze, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **motion carried.**

Mr. Amato again stated the reason the cameras were put in place back in 2005 was for safety. He offered a **motion for staff to prepare a resolution where all money city benefits from these violations, be spent on safety programs – anything that will make the city safer.** This would start September 1. Seconded by Paul Freeze.

Discussion followed. The definition of safety was then debated.

Bill Moritz liked the idea but wants a work session on this topic before action is taken. Staff needs to provide their input.

Ms. Borgelt questioned whether this could be voted on now since it was not on agenda.

Mr. Sweeney clarified, city is not spending money, and it is related to the ATS contract, so it can be voted on without being on agenda.

Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freeze, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes, 8 yeas, **motion carried.**

MOTIONS – A motion authorizing the Mayor to sign a memo approving the Hillsboro TIF appointments of Charles Martin, Joseph McCraith and Robert Armstrong was discussed. Bill Moritz offered a motion and he so moved. Seconded by Doris Borgelt. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato, yes; Freeze, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 8 yeas, **motion carried.**

Councilman Amato asked to be excused as he was not feeling well and he left the meeting at 8:12 pm. Mayor excused him and Mr. Amato left.

NEW BUSINESS

Ken Moss asked, that since we have been amending the agenda the last few meetings to move the Administrative Reports with the Conditional Use Application forward in the meeting, could we consider changing this order on the agenda?

Attorney Sweeney advised the order of the meeting is specifically defined in the ordinances and we could change it. Right now, it is easier to just amend. Mr. Unrein will look into this as ordinance could be amended.

Bill Moritz referred to the motion about looking into MoDot allowing us better signage for the photo enforcement and he would also like us to talk to MoDot to improve awareness to people not from this area. He was curious about how many folks in Arnold actually have run red lights again and again. He was advised, we do not have this data available. It would have to be pulled by hand.

Doris Borgelt questioned why someone in a city truck was taking pictures of a business in Arnold. She also commented about the high grasses in 4 locations in Ward 1 and the city's property on Lonedell being hazardous, especially since kids are hanging out there. This is a safety issue that needs to be addressed.

OLD BUSINESS

Ken Moss requested all meeting agendas and minutes be posted on the web site. He asked that all agendas from all committee meetings etc be provided to council so they can attend if they desire. Matt Unrein acknowledged this could be done. Mr. Moss feels this will keep all informed.

Sandra Kownacki asked whom she should contact with grass cutting issues and was advised to contact Matt Unrein.

Bill Moritz referred to the sidewalk fund and indicated sidewalks are needed along Richardson Road and asked if something can be done.

Mary Holden advised the Comprehensive Plan Update addresses this.

Matt Unrein shared that road repairs will come first in the budget and then sidewalks. He will however provide a list of what money is in the sidewalk fund.

Paul Freese questioned if there were separate areas of sidewalk funding?

Matt Unrein reported there is a sidewalk fund and he will see what monies are there.

Jim Edwards asked for clarification regarding grass violation procedures.

Mary Holden explained when grass exceeds the 10 inches, a 10-day notice goes out and 10 days later, if not cut, city has it cut. Most recently, 90 violation letters went out.

Doris Borgelt reported she had investigated and now disagrees with the information reported in a recent meeting. She checked with the fire department about the incidents of carbon monoxide poisoning and has learned they were not from HVAC installations.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Dan Kroupa reported on the finance committee meeting and capital needs presentations given by department heads for the past few months. He encourages city to update technology and increase the budget to do so.

Jim Edwards reported there had been a liquor committee meeting earlier tonight and renewal applications were reviewed as current liquor licenses expire June 30th. He was offering a **motion to approve those on the attached list that have completed and fulfilled their obligations**. Seconded by Bill Moritz. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato (excused); Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 7 yeas, **motion carried**.

Mr. Edwards then made everyone aware of problems with a liquor license holder - El Paisano at 1424 Jeffco. Because of repeated violations at the location, Chief is recommending, and committee is endorsing, revocation and non renewal of their liquor license. Jim Edwards **offered a motion and so moved to revoke the liquor license for El Paisano and not renew**. Seconded by Bill Moritz. Roll call vote: Moritz, yes; Edwards, yes; Amato (excused); Freese, yes; Kownacki, yes; Moss, yes; Borgelt, yes; Lang, yes; 7 yeas, **motion carried**.

Doris Borgelt reported she had attended her first Finance Committee meeting and learned that we need to be concerned about a future pension issue.

Deborah Lewis addressed her concerns indicating city will need to comply in 2013.

Mayor Counts – Reported the first meeting on Farmers Market was exciting and much interest is being show. There is a very talented committee working on this.

Ward 1 – Cricky Lang – Reported she had attended the ribbon cutting for Weight Watchers and heard something about Tenbrook road being outdated. She also wants city to look at grants for sidewalks. She has heard the individual schools determine if kids walk or ride the busses. Reported she had attended a Chamber meeting where Top Gun gave a presentation on violence and hostility in the workplace. She stated that Kelly from the Chamber has received numerous threatening messages that always mention the red light cameras.

Paul Freese commented he has talked with school officials and district discourages walking to school.

Mayor added, having been involved in the school, safety is their big concern and the students are safer on a bus than walking.

Ward 1 – Doris Borgelt – Suggested Top Gun give the presentation to council regarding violence and hostility in the workplace.

Ken Moss added this could be beneficial to city and the employees.
