### **OLD BUSINESS**

Paul Freese asked for an update to our grant application with East-West Gateway. Bryan Richison informed the council that our grant application for intersection improvements at Jeffco and Tenbrook was not on the list of approved applications. Mr. Richison recently attended a Jefferson County Economic Development Council meeting and it seems a lot of applications from Jefferson County were not approved. There were a very high number of applications received. The City can always re-apply at a later time. Mary Holden reminded the council that the Safe Routes to School grant application was turned down the first time also. We can always re-apply.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Phil Amato invited Randy Hoselton to the microphone to give an update from the Veterans Commission. Mr. Hoselton informed council that the Friends for Flags Initiative has launched and they have already distributed 5 kits to area businesses.

Dan Kroupa stated that the Finance Committee met last week and discussed going out for bid for City banking services. Deborah Lewis will be researching costs involved in changing banks so that we are more informed when receiving bids for the services themselves. You must also consider the costs of changing banks, as it is a big undertaking. Mr. Kroupa also complimented the Mayor on his Finance Committee appointments this year.

Jason Fulbright informed the council that the Economic Development Committee met earlier this evening. They discussed ways to spur economic development within the city. Some of these ideas were to hold another economic development summit in the fall, look into co-working space and a possible food trucks event. Mr. Fulbright asked if there were any objections to the committee ratifying these items that came from their meeting tonight and moving forward with their research of these ideas. There being no objection, the committee will continue their work on these ideas.

### **REPORTS FROM MAYOR & COUNCIL**

**Mayor Ron Counts** – Congratulated Susie Boone on the success of the Farmers Market last Saturday. It was so busy that he even helped park cars that day. He also complimented Mary Holden on her work with Fox 2 News regarding their story on euthanasia's performed at area Animal Control Centers. Fox 2 News interviewed Ms. Holden as a success story because the City of Arnold has one of the lowest percentages of euthanasia's in the area. Mayor Counts stated he contributes much of that success to the leadership of Mary Holden.

Ward 2 – Mary Elizabeth Coleman – Thanked Nancy Crisler for her hard work and dedication in regards to her involvement with the City's Animal Control facility.

Ward 3 – Phil Amato – Apologized to Nancy Crisler for making the motion himself on Resolution 14-24. He should have let her take the lead on that motion, as she has done so much work regarding the Animal Control facility. He thanked Nancy, Mary Holden and Susie Boone for their hard work in helping the animals.

# **ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS**

**Chief Robert Shockey** – Thanked Phil Amato and Mayor Counts for attending today's Law Enforcement Memorial. Two of Arnold's law enforcement officials who were killed in the line of duty in the 1970's were honored at today's event. This event occurs every year on May 15<sup>th</sup>. Our State Representative has introduced a bill into legislation that will rename part of Highway 55 by Fox Schools after Steve Jarvis, who was killed in the line of duty along that part of the highway. This should occur sometime this summer. There will be a fund raiser to help pay for the sign.

**City Administrator, Bryan Richison** – Informed the council that he, Gary Plunk and Nancy Crisler will be in Jefferson City on June 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> to attend the MML Elected Officials Training Conference. The June work session is on the 12<sup>th</sup> and asked if there were any objections to changing the date of the work session to Wednesday, June 11<sup>th</sup> so that they may attend. There being no objections, the June work session will be moved to Wednesday, June 11<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Richison also wanted to commend the Mayor and his wife on their hard work in making the Farmers Market a success. Susie Boone and Teresa Kohut do a great job, but the Mayor and his wife do not take enough credit for their efforts. He also echoed the wonderful comments towards Mary Holden and staff in regards to their efforts with Animal Control. He knows that Mary will say it is only possible because of the rescue groups that assist in placing animals, but Mary and her staff work very hard at making our Animal Control a success.

**Susie Boone** – Informed council that it appears, as of today, that the outdoor pool at the Recreation Center did not sustain any major damage over the winter. There were two small leaks and they have been repaired. Food trucks have already been assigned to the July  $4^{\text{th}}$  celebration and more will be added. She also wanted to inform everyone that the 9-11 memorial at the Recreation Center has made it into the 9-11 museum located in New York City.

**Mary Holden** – Thanked everyone for their kind words. She stated that Bryan is correct; the bulk of the credit for the City's Animal Control facility is due to the rescue groups that advertise and help place animals. She was very happy that Arnold was showcased in such a positive light.

Ed Blattner – Stated that access to City Hall will be very limited this Saturday as the parking lot is scheduled to be re-striped. Mr. Blattner is also working on the specs for the above ground diesel storage tank. The cost for the tank itself could be over \$15,000 and the entire project could reach \$30,000 to \$40,000. He is letting council know now so they won't be shocked when they see the actual report.

A motion to adjourn meeting was made by Paul Freese. Seconded by Nancy Crisler.
