GH Development has submitted for approval of a minor record plat to split the property at 1384 Jeffco Blvd. (former UMB location) into two lots. Lot 1 is proposed be 2.39 acres and Lot 2 is proposed at 1.25 acre. The site is zoned C-2. Attached are the application and plans.

Summary of Planning Commission Meeting and Recommendation

The Planning Commission held a public hearing and considered this request at the April 24, 2018 meeting. Only one person, Mrs. Nancy Wamser, spoke during the public hearing expressing her concern about the existing erosion in the wooded area of the site, adjacent to her property. During the regular meeting, there was minimal discussion amongst the Planning Commission members about the need for a traffic study. It was explained Jeffco Blvd is Mo DOT right-of-way and the City had no jurisdiction regarding Jeffco Blvd. The Commission voted 8-0 to recommend approval with the below conditions to be met prior to signing the record plat:

- 1. Please show all existing easements on the record plat. Since this plat will not vacate them, they must be shown. All easements to be vacated will need to be done separate from this record plat since it requires the approval of various utility companies.
- 2. Indicate the tree preservation area on the record plat and provide a written description.
- 3. Utility easements along the property line are typically 10 feet on each side for a total of 20 feet in the commercial area. Please revise accordingly.

Analysis





Mr. Steve Moddert has submitted plans for approval of a minor record plat for his property at 2228 Tenbrook Road. The site is proposed for two lots, with lot 1 proposed to be 9,094 square feet and lot 2 proposed to be 12,471 square feet. Attached are the application, aerial of the site and the plat.

Summary of Planning Commission Meeting and Recommendation

The Planning Commission held a public hearing and considered this request at their April 24, 2018 meeting. Only one person spoke, Mr. Dennis Lukeshaw, expressing his support of the subdivision. There was no discussion during the regular meeting and the Commission voted 7-1 to forward a recommendation of approval of the record plat.

Analysis

The site is zoned R-5 Residential, requiring a minimum lot size of 8,000 square feet. The proposed lots meet the minimum.


There was a question amongst Staff regarding the non-conforming nature of the existing structure, garage, fence and shed due to all of them being in the various setbacks. Staff questioned if a variance was needed since the non-conforming provisions only addresses expansions of a non-conforming and this request will actually decrease the non-conforming by removing a portion of the lot and return it to a conforming use of residential. In addition, the business has been in existence since before the City incorporated and has not ceased for more than 60 days, which had it ceased would have prompted the need for variances. Therefore, variances are not required at this time. However, we do want to make note and place in this record that the property is an existing non-conforming use and subject to the provisions in Section 405.050.D.1-8 and E.1-3. This includes work on a non-conforming structure may not exceed 10% of the current replacement cost of the non-conforming structure in a 12 month period, unless it is to strengthen or restore to a safe condition.





AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 500, ARTICLE I IMPLEMENTING A MANDATORY COMPLIANCE/OCCUPANCY INSPECTION PROCEDURE

WHEREAS, the City of Arnold, in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, has enacted certain property maintenance and zoning regulations; and

WHEREAS, property owners are obligated and required to keep properties in a safe and well-maintained manner; and

WHEREAS, the City of Arnold has determined that it shall be unlawful for the owner of any structure to sell, transfer, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of said structure or any part thereof to another until he/she has secured a certificate of compliance/occupancy for the entire structure and premises; and

WHEREAS, compliance with obtaining a certificate of compliance/occupancy is voluntary; and

WHEREAS, the City of Arnold has determined that voluntary compliance has not been satisfactorily successful;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 500, Article I, is hereby amended with the addition of a new Chapter 500, Article I, Section 500.095 as follows:

"SECTION 500.095: MANDATORY COMPLIANCE/OCCUPANCY INSPECTION

- A. The Community Development Department through its Director shall instigate a mandatory inspection of a structure or dwelling unit if any one of the following conditions exists:
 - 1. If the structure has not been inspected for a period of ten (10) years or more and the occupancy of the structure has changed during that time; or
 - 2. If a structure or dwelling unit is a rental unit and has not been inspected for a period of three (3) years or more and the occupancy of the structure has changed during that time; or
 - 3. If the Community Development Department has received more than one (1) complaint regarding the condition of the structure or dwelling unit; or
- B. If the Community Development Department determines that one or more of the events in Subsection A has occurred, the Department shall notify the owner and/or tenant of the

occurrence. The owner and/or tenant shall have ten (10) days to schedule an inspection or provide information disproving, to the sole satisfaction of the Department, that the condition(s) has not occurred.

Notice, as required by this subsection, shall be satisfied if the information is provided to the owner and/or tenant by: U.S. Mail, email, or publication in a paper of general circulation.

- C. Failure to schedule an inspection or disprove the condition within ten (10) days of the notice shall result in the issuance, by the Department, of a Notice to Vacate".
- D. If a "Notice to Vacate" is issued, the owner and/or tenant shall have ten (10) days to vacate the structure or dwelling unit.
- E. If the owner and/or tenant has not vacated the structure or dwelling unit as required by this section, the City shall declare the structure or dwelling unit as uninhabitable and remove the occupants."

<u>Section 2</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Council and its approval by the Mayor.

Article 1. SCO	PPE OF WORK:		

The Contractor shall furnish all materials and everything necessary to perform, in accordance with the Specifications and terms of this Contract, the work of providing grass cutting services as specified in bid proposal for the City of Arnold, Missouri.

Article 2. TIME OF COMPLETION:

Services must begin within fifteen (15) days, after written notice to proceed shall have been given to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate to secure its full completion.

Article 3. CONTRACT PRICE:

The City shall pay to the Contractor for the performance of the work a sum not to exceed \$3,682.00 per cutting, subject to additions and deductions provided herein.

Article 4. PAYMENTS TO CONTRACTOR:

At least twenty (20) days before the City Council meeting at which the progress payment shall be presented for approval (but not more often than once a month), the Contractor will submit to the Owner a partial payment estimate filled out and signed by the Contractor covering the work performed during the period covered by the partial payment estimate and supported by such data as the Owner may reasonably require. If required, certified payrolls must accompany each partial payment request. The Owner will, within ten (10) days after receipt of each partial payment estimate, either submit it to Council for approval of payment, or return the partial payment estimate to the Contractor indicating in writing its reasons for refusing to approve payment. In the latter case, the Contractor may make the necessary corrections and resubmit the partial payment estimate. The Owner will, within ten (10) days following the first regular Council meeting at which the pay request can be put on the Council meeting agenda, pay the Contractor a progress

payment on the basis of the approved partial payment estimate. Regular Council meetings are held on first and third Thursdays of each month and the agenda for the Council meeting is set seven (7) days prior to each meeting. The Owner shall retain ten percent (10%) of the amount of each payment until final completion and acceptance of all work covered by the Contract Documents. Authorized extra work shall be included in these monthly progress payments. Submission of an executed project completion endorsement is required with final payment request.

- a. No payment shall be made for materials delivered or stored on the site.
- b. When the work provided for under this Contract has been fully completed in accordance with the terms thereof, the Owner shall make a final inspection and the Contractor shall remedy any defects arising out of said inspection. After final acceptance of the work by the Owner and receipt of final endorsement, final payment shall be made based on the price stated in Article 3.
- c. From the final payment shall be retained all monies expended by the Owner according to the terms of this Contract, and thereunder chargeable to the Contractor, all monies payable to the Owner, as liquidated damages, and all deductions provided by Contract, State Laws, or Ordinances of the City of Arnold.
- The Contractor will indemnify and save the Owner or the Owner's agents harmless from all claims growing out of the lawful demands of subcontractors, laborers, workers, mechanics, furnisher of material, and furnisher of machinery and parts thereof, equipment, tools, and all supplies, incurred in the furtherance of the performance of the work. The Contractor shall, at the Owner's request, furnish satisfactory evidence that all obligations of the nature designated above have been paid, discharged, or waived. If the Contractor fails to do so, the Owner may, after having notified the Contractor, either pay unpaid bills or withhold from the Contractor's unpaid compensation a sum until satisfactory evidence is furnished that all liabilities have been fully discharged, whereupon payment to the Contractor shall be made, in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents, but in no event shall the provisions of this sentence be construed to impose any obligations upon the Owner to either the Contractor, his Surety, or any third party. In paying any unpaid bills of the Contractor, any payment so made by the Owner shall be considered as a payment made under the Contract Documents by the Owner to the Contractor and the Owner shall not be liable to the Contractor for any such payments made in good faith.

Article 5. GUARANTEE:

The Contractor and his Surety hereby expressly guarantee the aforesaid work as to workmanship and quality of materials used in connection therewith, for a period of one year, commencing on the date of acceptance of the work or improvements, and binds himself, his successors or assigns, to make all replacements which may become necessary

within that time due to nonconformity with the Specifications. Whenever notified by the City that said replacements are required, the Contractor shall, at once, make the same as directed, and at his own expense. If the Contractor does not proceed with such replacements within five (5) days of receipt of written notice, then the City shall have the power to cause the same to be made and to charge the cost thereof to the Contractor. Nothing in this Section is intended as a maintenance guarantee.

Article 6. INDEMNITY:

Contractor shall indemnify Arnold City, its elected officials, officers, employees and volunteers and hold it harmless from and against each and every claim which may be made against Arnold City, its elected officials, officers, employees and volunteers for death, personal injury, or property damage which is in any way connected to contractor's operations under this Agreement. Contractor's obligation under this shall include the obligation to defend any and all such claims which may be made against Arnold and to pay all costs, including attorney's fees, which are paid by Arnold.

Article 7. INSURANCE:

Contractor shall, at contractor's sole expense, maintain a policy of comprehensive commercial liability insurance insuring Arnold's interests against claims for personal injury, bodily injury, death, and property damage arising out of contractor's operation during the fulfillment of required duties under this Agreement, covering personal injury liability, bodily injury liability and property damage liability of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) in the aggregate. Arnold must be endorsed as an additional insured on such policy. Contractor shall provide Arnold a current Certificates of Insurance evidencing contractor's compliance with this Paragraph prior to commencing work. Violation of this paragraph shall be grounds for Arnold to delay the execution or terminate the agreement, and Arnold shall incur no liability to contractor should it do so.

Article 8. STATUTORY AND REGULATORY COMPLIANCE:

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure compliance with all federal, state and local requirements, including, but not limited to, the following Revised Statutes of the State of Missouri:

292.675 RSMo. OSHA Training.

290.550 et seq. -580 RSMo. Excessive Unemployment.

34.353 et seq. RSMo. American Products.

The above list is not intended to be exhaustive; and the compliance requirement of this provision is continuing and must be satisfied during the entirety of this Agreement.

It is the sole responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that this provision is satisfied; and the City assumes no responsibility or liability for the failure to comply. Any penalty

incurred as a result of noncompliance or failure to comply will be borne solely by the Contractor.

Article 9. THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS:

The Advertisement, Information for Bidders, the Specifications, including Addenda Nos. _N/A_, N/A_, and N/A_, and the Bid, together with this Agreement, form the Contract.
